### Alzheimer's Awareness Month

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed November as National Alzheimer's Awareness Month. Unfortunately, Alzheimer's Disease is the most common form of dementia and affects approximately 5.4 million Americans and is the sixth leading cause of death. This month aims to raise awareness about the disease

and focuses on caregiver support and resources. 83% of the help provided to older adults in the U.S. comes from family members, friends, unpaid caregivers and 30% of the caregivers are aged 65 and older. Nearly half of all caregivers provide assistance to someone with Alzheimer's or another dementia. There is help and support. **Please contact the Alzheimer's Association of the Hudson Valley.** They offer online education as well as Support Groups for caregivers, individuals living with Alzheimer's Disease and others.
