


**Holy Thursday**

On Holy Thursday, we will commemorate the Last Supper, the institution of the priesthood, and of the Eucharist with our evening Mass at 7:30. After Mass, The Tabernacle of Repose will be stationed at the side altar for those who would like to spend quiet time in adoration of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament until 10pm.

**Good Friday**

Our Good Friday services will be Stations of the Cross at noon, and the Commemoration of the Lord’s Passion with Holy Communion at 3pm. One of the ways we show our Lord that we are thankful for his dying on the cross for us is by commemorating it.



**Good Friday Fast and Abstinence**

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence:

- *Abstinence* from meat (beef, veal, pork, chicken, but not seafood) on those who are over 14 years old.
- *Fasting* binds for those between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting entails eating only three times a day: two light meals and a moderate main meal. Health problems may moderate the fasting obligations.

**Holy Saturday**

Holy Saturday is a quiet day, the quietest day of the Church’s year. The church will be open for silent visits.

**Easter Vigil**

The Easter Vigil is the most solemn, most important Mass of the year. So, if it is possible, please try to attend the Easter Vigil. It is at 8pm on Holy Saturday night.

Our Masses on Easter Sunday will be at 8am and 10 am.



**HISTORY OF THE TRIDUUM** By the second century, Christians celebrated the great Easter Vigil, an event which began the night of Holy Saturday, continuing until dawn on Easter morning. During this vigil Christians commemorated salvation history, awaited the return of Jesus, and celebrated the resurrection of Jesus at dawn on Easter Sunday. At the vigil catechumens were baptized and received first communion. At the time the Easter Vigil was the most important celebration of the liturgical year. Eventually Christians expanded this celebration to a three-day commemoration of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection with the Easter Vigil being the high point of the three day commemoration known as the Triduum (Latin for "three days"). Over time as the liturgical year expanded, the Easter Vigil lost its preeminence, although the three days commemorating Jesus' passion still held an important place in the Church. Since the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, the Easter Vigil and the Triduum have regained their position of prominence in the Western Catholic liturgical calendar. (*All Saints Press*)
