St. Joseph's Parish Celebrates 150th Anniversary

November 17, 2018, 5:00 p.m. Mass

The Church met with opposition from various members of the community which is a well-known fact. When we consider the tumultuous history of Kingston, we can appreciate the opposition to the establishment of a Catholic parish. Many people were suspicious and distrusted the church whose ecclesiastical center was Rome. Some believed that the presence of a Catholic Church and school would depreciate property values! The early pastors were not able to negotiate for property in the open. Each piece of real estate was bought through agents due to obstacles that arose when the Church expressed an interest in a property.

Fr. Dougherty offered Mass at the school house on Fair Street until July 1869. The present Church was dedicated on July 27, 1869. It was 42 years later when the truth about the acquisition came to light. The new Parish had to prove to doubters that the Catholic Church in America was made up of patriotic citizens who loved their country as much as the early colonists who fought for democracy. This sense of challenge and dedication molded the Catholic community in Kingston, and the first parishioners of St. Joseph's were extraordinarily generous with their support to the new Church.
