Fr. George's Email

“I reached home after five days of stressful and unpredictable journey. There was torrential rain and unprecedented flood in Kerala. Many flights were canceled to Kerala including mine from Abudabi because the airports in Kerala were all covered with flood. Many thousands of homes were immersed in flood. There were terrible tragedy and loss of life and property. When the flood receded and communication and transportations were restored, I was able to reach home after five days waiting in several airports.

My mother was resistant to any antibiotics and finally the doctor gave her the strongest possible antibiotics. Now it seems that it has some effect on her morbid condition. I spent most of the time during the day with her in the hospital. She is in the hospital now for more than twenty days. In any case I hope to return to the seminary, the place of my new assignment by the end of the month.

I thank all the parishioners for praying for my mother. Regards to all the staff in the Rectory. Wish you all an enjoyable weekend and with good wishes and prayers.”
