### HOLY WATER

In the Old Testament, Jews washed with water before entering the Temple precincts. Building on this familiar ritual to the Jews, John the Baptist used water to represent repentance of sin and purification.

So when we cross ourselves with holy water entering and leaving our church, we recall that history. This act also refers to our Baptism when the priest used water to symbolically wash away our sin and protect us from evil.
