Pastor's Notes

Update on St. Joseph's Parish Center (New School Building)

We had hoped to have the parking lot paved before the winter. However, cancelation of the Kingston City Board Meeting prevented us from getting all the approvals needed to complete the parking lot. Paving will be done in spring, but you can still park there.

Closing for the Old School/convent will take place mid-January. We cannot initiate the elevator or chapel projects until we receive funding from the sale of the buildings. We also have to re-do the church roof in the spring. This means several projects will be initiated in the spring. In the meantime, the parking lot, meeting area, and dining area are useable without handicap accessibility. Parish groups have been already using the 1st floor meeting rooms.

While much still has to be done, I believe the Parish Center will give us amazing possibilities to offer many programs for our parish.
