ASH WEDNESDAY—Lent begins on February 26, 2020 and is a day of fast and abstinence. Ashes will be distributed at the 7:00 and 9:00 a.m. Masses; at a 12:15 p.m. Service (not a Mass); and 6:30 p.m. Mass.

RULES FOR FASTING and ABSTINENCE—**fasting means eating only one full meal.** Two smaller meals may be taken which do not equal the full meal. Good Friday is a fast day. Everyone between the ages of 18 and 59 is bound to the fasting obligation. **Abstinence means not eating meat.** Meat consumption is forbidden on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation begins at age 14 and has no upper limit.
