RULES FOR FASTING and ABSTINENCE—fasting means eating only one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken which do not equal the full meal. Good Friday is a fast day. Everyone between the ages of 18 and 59 is bound to the fasting obligation. **Abstinence means not eating meat.** Meat consumption is forbidden on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation begins at age 14 and has no upper limit.

Faith is usually thought of as an intellectual assent to doctrines; however, in Jesus' time it was not so narrowly understood. It described the basic trust on which a relationship was built. It acknowledged that the other person was trustworthy and dependable and thus, could be relied on with confidence.
