Today’s Gospel is one of the most beautifully written by St. Luke and offers a wealth of religious (theological) insight. God’s word should be “burning within” us as often as we meditatively read it at home (and listen to it in church—when we can again assembly).

- We come to you with confidence, knowing that you truly are our compassionate mother, health of the sick and cause of our joy.
