Registrations: forms have been sent to all families. Please return these as soon as possible. Any new family or family of a first grader should contact the Religious Education Office at: (845)663-2116 for a registration form. Obviously, we, like everyone else, are waiting to see what decisions are made for children returning to school in September. If they return with the 6 foot social and physical distancing requirement, we are blessed with large classrooms that can accommodate 14 children. However, this could require an additional session on Tuesday evenings to assure no more than 14 children are in any classroom. Changes to our entry, exit, and restroom use procedures will be adjusted to meet the current best practice norms.
