Parish Fall Workday: Oct 13th!

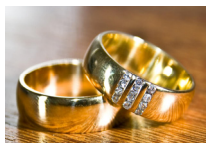

Sponsored by our 8th Grade class, we will have a haunted house, games, cakewalk, silent auction, food and fun for all!

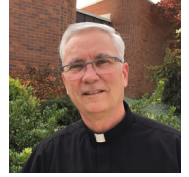
Proceeds will benefit the 8th Grade trip to Nature Bridge.

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

Earlier this week, Pope Francis convoked a Synod of Bishops dedicated to the great concern of how does the Church in this present age minister to the young among us. Characteristic of Pope Francis, the very opening words of his "Working Document" for the Synod set the tone of that concern within the concept of *accompaniment*:

"In just a few words, this is the specific scope of the upcoming Synod: just as our Lord Jesus Christ walked alongside the disciples of Emmaus (cf. Lk 24:13-35), the Church is also urged to accompany all young people, without exception, towards the joy of love."

That Francis uses the image of the disciples' encounter with the Risen Jesus as the manifestation of that accompaniment is really a wonderful beginning; Jesus' walking along with the two beleaguered disciples whose heads hang so low under the weight of the horrors they have just witnessed in Jerusalem does indeed offer a powerful example of just how we as a Church support, serve, and,

indeed, *accompany* our young people in their lives.

I personally love this image from the post-resurrection Gospel stories because it was the touchstone of so much of my work during my years at pastor to the Catholic students of WSU in Pullman; *walking with* those young Cougs during the ups and downs of their often tumultuous lives was humbling and inspiring for me as I witnessed their sometimes slow and other times quite fast-paced journey to maturity in the things of faith and the challenges of love. Sometimes, I had a few good answers to their questions, but most of the time, by just walking with them as they tried to figure things out for themselves I was able to guide them to see the bigger picture and the greater good. Especially, when they felt abandoned by God, at least they knew they were not abandoned by me and so gradually they could come back to knowing God at work in their lives.

I think this is the heart of all ministry, not just ministry to the young: *we walk together*. We are on many paths, but the same pilgrimage, *so together* we support and care and love one another along the way. When one is tired, the other offers a shoulder. When one is hurting, the other seeks to heal. When one is lost, the other searches, finds, guides back. This is how Jesus works in the Gospels and how we are to work, too.

Let us pray for the success of the Synod and let us pray for our parish's young parishioners! May they and all of us walk together joyfully on the Way to God's Kingdom!
