Dear Parishioners,

It is that time of year again to submit to you *The Annual Report to the Parish* for the last Fiscal Year which ran from September 1st, 2020 to August 31st, 2021. I am so grateful to Mr. Bill Kennedy, our Parish Financial Director, for the tremendous work he does in managing our Parish Resources, to our Rectory and School Staff, and to our Finance Council, Trustees, and Parish Council for all their dedication and support. We are so blessed to have such fine Priests and Deacons serving our Parish, and so many wonderful parishioners giving so much of themselves for the good of our Parish and School.

Included with this Report is a Financial Statement for the last Fiscal Year compared with the prior year. Please take time to review it and do not hesitate to bring up any questions or concerns you may have. The numbers reflect all the good work that goes on here every day. Above all, at the very heart of our parish life is our worship of God as a Parish Family at Mass on the Lord's Day. Everything else flows from our union with the Heart of Jesus in the Eucharist.

This turned out to be a tremendous year for our Parish given the fact that last year at this time we were quite concerned about how things would go. We were looking at the operating costs for our Church and School soaring due to the extra expenses caused by the pandemic. At the same time, our weekly collections in the Church were down significantly with many not yet returning to Mass, and a significant amount of income was lost to the School since most of the tremendous fund raising activities sponsored by our Parent Student Association (PSA) and the operation of the cafeteria and before and after school programs had to cease due to COVID restrictions. We were concerned about having to dip significantly into our Parish Savings to cover our expenses in the Church and subsidize the School.

Instead, this past fiscal year turned out to be a great success and a testimony to the strength of our Parish and the generosity and concern of our faithful Parishioners. Over this past year our Parishioners have returned to Mass in strong numbers and our weekly collections have returned to where they were pre-COIVD and even a little higher. With your generosity and our efforts to minimize expenses, we were able to meet all our financial obligations in the Church and School without having to tap into our Parish Savings. All I can say to you is THANK YOU!

Despite the challenges that this Pandemic has presented, our Parish and School remain as strong as ever. Again, that is a testimony to you, our faithful parishioners, to your goodness, your faith, your generosity, and your love. This Parish and School was built on the sacrifices of the people of this Parish 59 years ago, and it is your sacrifices today that will ensure that this beautiful Parish and School will be here to serve many, many more generations to come.

Please know that I, Father Charles, Father Connolly, our Deacons, and our Rectory Staff are here to serve you and will always make ourselves available to you. In an emergency we Priests can be reached and will come to you any time of day or night. Your Priests hold you and your families in our hearts and our prayers every day, especially when we offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Let us continue to work together to keep our beautiful Parish strong in every way and to grow ever richer in faith, hope, and love. May God bless us all.

NOTES

CHURCH

- 1. Last year, we mentioned that we expected to have to go into our reserves because of the additional COVID costs. We were very careful this year to minimize upgrades and Capital Improvements. Because of this and because of increased donations we did not have to go into our reserves. Some Capital Improvement renovations funds were used to make repairs to the Church, Rectory and Parking Lot.
- 2. In May, 2020 we received a Payroll Protection loan from the Federal Government for \$461,775 to cover 10 weeks of salary and benefits for the school staff in the 2019-2020 fiscal year. The loan was forgiven by the Federal Government in May 2021.
- 3. Sunday and Holy Day offerings this year were \$65,881 higher than last year. This was helped by people returning to the church after the COVID shutdown. Our collections are now higher than they were before COVID.
- 4. Interest and dividend income primarily represents \$84,000 on an endowment currently on deposit with the Archdiocese of New York. The balance of \$16,846 is income from other invested funds.
- 5. Church, Rectory and Center expenses include the priests' and lay personnel salaries and benefits, heating and electricity, household expenses, insurance, maintenance, repair and office expenses.
- 6. The Archdiocesan School Tax is a tax to be used for regional schools. Our assessed amount was \$21,109. This is a reduced rate because we have a parish based school.
- 7. Reserve Funds represents our funds held for future capital improvements and unforeseen events.

SCHOOL

- 1. Cost per student was \$6,021. This was significantly higher than last year because of COVID expenses. Of this, \$4,241 comes from tuition. The balance comes from scholarships, fund raisers, donations and parish support. Unfortunately we not able to run the Before and After school programs, the Cafeteria and many other school activities and fund raisers this past year because of the COVID-19 closings. Normally we would have received well over \$300,000 from these programs. The student population at the end of the school year was 392.
- 2. Fundraisers by the Parent School Association and SCRIPT amounted to \$19,437 this year.
- 3. There were significant differences between income and expenses during the last two years due to income from Renew/Rebuild and expenses for technology and HVAC upgrades in the school. The surplus we had last year of \$167,400 was used to for expenses this year.
- 4. We expect reimbursements from FEMA and other government programs to cover some of our extra expenses that put us in the "red".

CEMETERY

For the year 2020-2021 there were 34 burials, 6 plots and 5 niches sold.

OTHER

Our current investment market value of securities held increased by \$218,652 for the year ending August 31, 2021. It is the parishes' policy that we maintain a 60% stock and 40% fixed ratio for our investment.

2021 CARDINAL'S CAMPAIGN

We were assessed \$171,000. The total amount pledged was \$179,800, exceeding our goal by \$8,800. We will receive 60% of the amount we are over our goal.
