Dear Parishioners and Friends of Saint Teresa Church,

A few years ago, several dozen members of our parish responded to my invitation to go with me to Old Saint Patrick's Cathedral in lower Manhattan. We received a guided tour of the historic church, saw the catacombs and surrounding property, visited another church nearby, and had a meal in Little Italy. This interesting and very pleasant community-building experience is still mentioned today when those pilgrims see one another.

I was thinking of that after a recent visit to the DeWint House, which was General George Washington's Headquarters in Tappan. Tappan is close to my former parish of Saint Catharine of Alexandria Church in Blauvelt. And so I decided to arrange another trip – historical, culinary, and spiritual - for whoever might like to come.

I have made arrangements for Wednesday, June 30, just before we celebrate Independence Day. Tappan is about an hour's drive from here, with easy access from the Palisades Parkway. Getting there independently, but with clear directions, we will meet at General Washington's Headquarters between 10:30 and 10:50am. Mr. Harold Jones will greet us at the museum and show a short orientation film. Then we will have time to look at the fascinating displays, and go to see and be in the home of the DeWint Family. General Washington stayed in those rooms four times between 1776 and 1780—most notably for the trial and execution of Major John Andre, who was caught carrying secret papers from Benedict Arnold to betray the defenses at West Point. He returned at the end of the war to arrange for the orderly departure of the defeated British troops who were still in Manhattan.

After seeing the property, which has been owned by and cared for since the 1930s by the Masonic Order, of which George Washington was a member, we will go a few streets away to a beautifully preserved tavern - the Old '76 House – where Major John Andre was kept during his trial. The story of Major Andre is a sad one. He was a British soldier, but in civilian clothes and therefore treated as a spy. He is much more admirable than Benedict Arnold. Andre died by hanging on a nearby street now named Andre Hill, while Arnold escaped to England.

After we eat, you can visit the monument on Andre Hill if you wish, and then proceed along Western Highway. You will pass Dominican College, and the headquarters of the Blauvelt Dominican Sisters. Your destination: Saint Catharine of Alexandria Church, where I was privileged to serve as pastor from 1991 to 2002.

I have arranged with the present pastor, Msgr. Francis McAree, for us to see the church property and at 3pm to offer a Mass in honor of Saint Catharine. I want to share the story of this courageous young martyr from 4th century Egypt. I expect that some Blauvelt parishioners will join us for Mass and will want to say hello to you.

That will conclude the official part of the day. You may head home directly, or you can explore other parts of Rockland County, such as Nyack and Piermont. The Palisades Mall is not far away and may be another attraction.

Driving with friends is practical and pleasant. Plan on leaving Staten Island about 9:30, and getting home about 6. The only cost is your lunch at the Old '76 House. (Figure about \$40 with beverages extra.) Two of our parishioners scouted the restaurant for us last week and sampled the cuisine. They were very pleased with the food and the ambiance, and with the innkeeper, who will tell us about the interesting history of his tavern.

In order for each part of our visit – museum, tavern, and church—to welcome us properly, people there would like to know how many of us to prepare for. Please decide by June 22, and give your names and contact information to myself or Lisa at the rectory (718 442 5412). You might want to contribute something for the upkeep of the DeWint House, but everything else is free - especially the chance to meet and talk with other members of our community. And if we are in a more patriotic mood for this Fourth of July, people will know why.

Whether or not this particular daytrip interests you, I encourage you to plan interesting things to do and beautiful places to see this summer. Reconnect with family and friends. God gives us one another, and each new season, for us to enjoy his blessings.

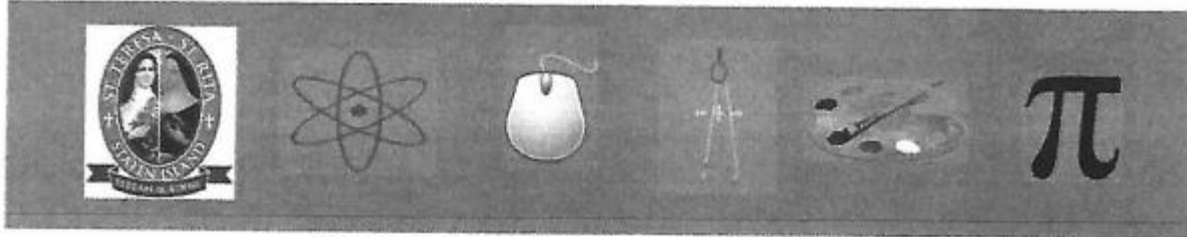

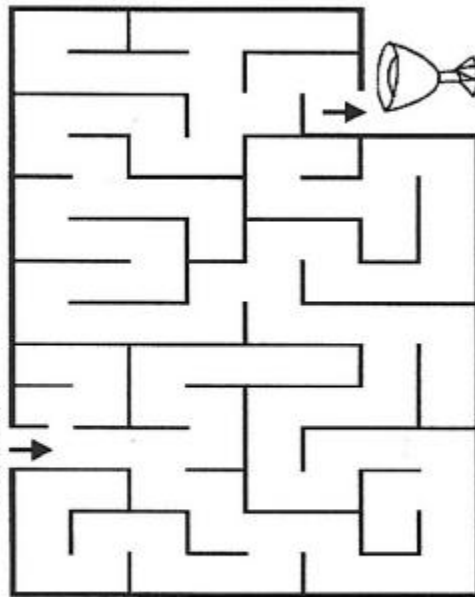
