FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses explains to the people that a prophet will come from among them, and that they should listen to this prophet's words, for God has told him of this prophet. God also tells Moses that anyone who pretends to speak in his words, or speaks in the name of other gods shall die.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

Paul tells the Corinthians how an unmarried man or woman is able to devote themselves fully to God without concern for the needs of a spouse. Paul explains that God wants to help them promote good and devote themselves more fully to God.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

As Jesus was teaching, a man with an unclean spirit came to the synagogue and asked if Jesus had come to destroy them. Jesus ordered the spirit out of the man, who shrieked violently as the spirit departed. The people were amazed at the authority he had over the spirit.

5. Show your Appreciation

Everyone needs affirmation. The encouragement of a few parishioners helped one young priest to give better homilies. Another priest admitted that the affirmation of parishioners helped him recognize his musical abilities and learn how to use those gifts in his ministry.

Thank your priest for giving his life to you and to the Lord. Recognize how much work goes into making the parish run well. Tell your priest when you like something that he did or the way in which he handled a situation. You may want to drop him an encouraging note or leave a positive message on his voice mail. Remember his birthday, his anniversary of ordination and other special days. It's not necessary to send a gift - just the recognition of the event is an expression of appreciation and encouragement. ...don't be shy about asking your priest for ideas on how you can make his life a little easier or more enjoyable. You might be surprised to learn that some gesture you consider "small" means the world to a man who spends so much time and energy seeing to other's needs.

A final thought...

Jesus makes himself present to us in a special way through his priests – so whatever you do for your parish priest, you also do for the Lord. And whatever you do for the Lord helps to build the Kingdom of God right here on earth.

How You Can Help Increase Priestly Vocations

Pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood.

Offer your time and financial support to strengthen youth ministries in your parish

Teach your children and grandchildren how to listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

Ask your children and grandchildren if they ever thought about becoming a priest.

If you know someone who has the qualities of a good priest, point it out to him.

Pray for young men discerning priesthood.

Find ways to support and encourage seminarians in your diocese.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18th

In Lent, we are asked to prepare for the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord by means of fast and abstinence from meat on certain days. These regulations unite us to the prayerful activities of the whole Church throughout the world. They are binding on people from ages 14 to 59 years of age – except for those who are ill. **Meat should NOT be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting**, that is eating only one full meal during the day is **required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** and *may* be practiced on any other days. These regulations are *minimum* guidelines to help us get into the penitential spirit of Lent.

Thank you very much for allowing us to conduct our "Baby Bottle Campaign" in your parish. Now that the last coins have been deposited, we were able to raise \$6,172.54 with 338 bottles returned.

Last year, 130 women came to our center for assistance. Of the 40 who were considering abortion, we can confirm that 26 have chosen to continue their pregnancies. We also had 109 mothers participate in our pre-natal and parenting program and distributed more than \$22,500 in needed baby items.
