FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here on earth is quite limited and should be well spent.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice, but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill, and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved on to other villages to proclaim the good news.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As priests of the Archdiocese we gather together many times of the year for various meetings, discussions, Holy Hours, Recollections and Retreats. His Eminence Cardinal Dolan encourages his priests to make pilgrimages to the shrines and holy places in all parts of the world as New York priests and deepen our spiritual lives. He also joins them whenever he can. Every year I join these pilgrimages. This year we are on pilgrimage to the holy shrines of France. In fact when you read this message I will be at the Cathedral in Rouen, Paris for Midday prayers and we celebrate Mass in the evening at the Shrine of the Miraculous Medal.

When I told some of our parishioners that I was going on a pilgrimage to Shrines of France I got these reactions: Father that is great! Take plenty of pictures. Have a good time. Some even said, Gee! Who has a better life than you travelling to Europe on vacation! Finally some asked to pray for them.

Let me explain what I think. Pilgrimages are meant to energize us spiritually, mentally and physically. I have been to Lourdes twice already. This time I joined them because it covers more than six places of saints that I love. We begin our pilgrimage celebrating Mass at the House of Martin, the birth place of St. Therese of Lisieux. Then we come to spend time in the places of St. Joan of Arc, the Patron Saint of France who was burned alive on May 30, 1431. In Paris we spend time in the Shrine of the Miraculous Medal. Then we visit the places of St. Catherine Laboure and St. Vincent de Paul. The pilgrimage then moves to Norte Dame Cathedral. We also have a chance to visit the Blessed Sacrament Chapel where St Peter Julian Eymard had the first public Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. At Lourdes, we will celebrate Mass on February 11th the Feast Day of Lourdes, joining the torchlight procession at night praying the Rosary. We will visit the village of St. Bernadette. It is an amazing experience to be in the places where these saints lived and died for Christ. It truly inspires me to question my way of life and rededicate myself to serve Christ and His flock better. I will hold all of you in my heart during my pilgrimage and ask Jesus and Blessed Mother & these saints to shower blessings on you. I promise.

Trevor Matahsingh from Trinidad will be the Main Celebrant. There will be anointing of the sick during the Mass. All are welcome to attend.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE **Lent begins on Ash Wednesday,** **February 18th**

In Lent, we are asked to prepare for the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord by means of fast and abstinence from meat on certain days. These regulations unite us to the prayerful activities of the whole Church throughout the world. They are binding on people from ages 14 to 59 years of age – except for those who are ill. **Meat should NOT be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.** Fasting, that is eating only one full meal during the day is **required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** and *may* be practiced on any other days. These regulations are *minimum* guidelines to help us get into the penitential spirit of Lent.
