FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

From Cardinal Dolan...

Dear friends in the Lord:

The people of Africa are joyous and faith-filled, but they often face challenges due to poverty, the high incidence of disease, food shortages, and migration. The Church in Africa journeys with people gifted with a vibrant spirituality and is a source of hope and faith. **The Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa** supports pastoral projects that fosters lasting peace and reconciliation in a continent often marked by division and tension. Pope Francis challenges us: "Touched by Christ's infinite mercy, may all the faithful be signs of the reconciliation, justice and peace that God wills for...all of Africa" (April 16, 2015).

With so many people in Africa on the move, providing pastoral care to meet their spiritual needs is often difficult. In Angola, this is true for migrant and refugee communities, as well as for people whose livelihoods keep them moving, such as fisherman and truck drivers. Creating fellowship among various groups, ethnicities, and tribes is crucially important in order to avoid tribalism, discrimination, and racial violence.

To address these needs and foster growth in the communities, and with a grant from **The Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa**, the bishops are providing training and formation for lay leaders in every diocese. These leaders attend seminars and workshops that equip them to return to their communities to welcome immigrants and help them find a home in local parish communities. After attending a seminar, one participant expressed his gratitude, saying, "Thank you for yet another moment of grace."

With your help, **the Church in Africa** can continue to play an active role in the evangelization of the world. Projects like this one care for the spiritual needs of the African people, allowing Africans to continue giving the world their vibrant expressions of faith. LITURGICAL ETIQUETTE

External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. For this reason, we wish to remind our guests and parishioners from time to time of habits or practices that are not appropriate.

The rule of fasting from solid food for an hour before one receives the Eucharistic still holds, and thus makes **bringing coffee cups or chewing of gum** in Church completely disrespectful and inappropriate. Although the Church does not require everyone to be dressed in his or her "Easter finest" every week for Mass, please remember that the way we dress for Church is, oftentimes, a sign of how important the celebration of the Eucharist is to us. **Overly revealing clothing is never appropriate.**

Churches are meant to be sacred space, places where all can pray and worship. While a cordial greeting is never out of place, carrying on an **audible and protracted conversation is never appropriate.**

External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. The bow immediately before receiving Holy Communion should be done with the conscious recognition that it is the Lord himself before whom we bow. He is truly present in the Eucharist, in both the host and the cup, and in either of them. The extension of the hands must acknowledge our acceptance of a gift; not a grabbing for something owed us. The hands are completely empty, extended in the gesture of acceptance. **The Lord should not be just another item among keys or other personal items.** Our spoken and sung responses at Mass should be done communally, with whatever abilities were bestowed on us by our Father. What is believed and held in our hearts ought to be expressed outwardly during the Mass in work and in music.

Finally, out of respect and reverence for the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, **arriving at Mass on time and remaining until the priest has recessed down the aisle is appropriate behavior.** Leaving Mass early and disturbing the flow of communion in order to exit is never appropriate. Please place cell phones in the silent mode, and please remain in Church until the end of Mass to be blessed and commissioned to go forth in Christ's name.

ENCYCLICAL ON THE ENVIRONMENT

In his recent creation care encyclical, Pope Francis extends the pioneering work of the Second Vatican Council by drawing on the wisdom of other world religious leaders, for example, the Eastern Orthodox Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew. May Catholics everywhere join with members of the other world religions to demand an end to the destruction of our common home and of our impoverished brothers and sisters. Pope Francis' encyclical was well received by leaders and followers of other faiths. Find out if there are other faith groups in your neighborhood or town with whom you might collaborate on a common project to better the local environment with a Care of Creation Committee. Watch an inspiring 21-minute video, **#LightTheWay**, on YouTube on the interfaith vigil in New York City organized to thank Pope Francis for *Laudato Si'* and his challenge to world leaders.
