## **Puerto Rico Update**

Even two weeks after *Hurricane Maria* hit, the images and stories of the devastation in Puerto Rico continue to move our entire nation. We here in New York feel a special closeness to the people of Puerto Rico, as so many of us have friends, families, and loved ones with ties to that beautiful island. *Borriqueños* make up a cherished part of the Catholic family of the archdiocese.

I do have a bit of good news. After nearly two weeks of trying, I was finally able to reach Archbishop Roberto Gonzalez, the Archbishop of San Juan, and can report that he is doing well. So many people here in New York know and love Archbishop Roberto, as he served in this archdiocese for many years, and continues to be a beloved and well-respected friend of us all. I assured the archbishop of the love and prayers of this archdiocese, and he asked me to please express to you his deep gratitude. The archbishop was also grateful to learn of our efforts to provide material assistance to the people of Puerto Rico. I owe you an update on those efforts as well.

Although I like second collections about as much as you do, for three weeks in a row the people of the Archdiocese of New York responded with typical generosity, first for Texas, then for Florida, and finally for Puerto Rico. Thanks to you, we will be able to offer more than \$400,000 in direct relief for the people of Puerto Rico.

The priests of this archdiocese, particularly those with friends or family members in Puerto Rico, or those serving large Puerto Rican communities, have been asked to get us information about how the archdiocese can help. We are also preparing for any influx of people from Puerto Rico who may come to New York, so that the Church might be ready to warmly welcome them, and meet any immediate needs that they might have. Our parishes, schools, and Catholic Charities, are all gearing up to be of assistance. It is my hope to try and visit Puerto Rico sometime in the next few days, to personally express our love and concern, and bring some material assistance too. I will stay in touch with Archbishop Gonzalez to monitor situation there, and schedule a visit at a time when it would not hamper relief efforts that are underway.

Please know of my own sincere and deep gratitude for the goodness and care you have already shown, and will continue to show, for our brothers and sisters of Puerto Rico. I'll keep you posted.

## **St. Martin of Tours**

Martin was born in Pannonia (modern Hungary), and became a catechumen at the age of ten. While serving in the Roman Army, he met a poor, half-clothed man outside the city gate of Amiens. Martin drew his sword and divided his own cloak in two, giving half to the naked man. That night, he saw Jesus in a vision. "Martin, who is still but a catechumen, give me this robe," our Lord told the angels. After this, Martin "flew to be baptized." After he resigned from the army, he founded a monastic community in Gaul (modern France). In 372 he was elected Bishop of Tours, where he served his flock with great care until his death in 397.
