THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

An encomium for a good and worthy wife, this passage from Proverbs extols all the virtues which a worthy wife possesses – fidelity, industriousness, skill, charity to the poor, and fear of the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

Once again, Paul reassures the Thessalonians, who are anxious about the coming of Christ, that they need not fear being unprepared because they are “children of light.”

Gospel: Matthew 25:14-30

Jesus narrates the parable of the talents – in the story, the silver pieces given to the three men. Two of the men invest their coins and double their worth, but the third buries his coins in the ground and earns no return. The message of Jesus is that we must use to the fullest the talents we have received.

SP Clergy Statement on DACA...

“You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you too were once aliens of the land of Egypt.” (Leviticus 19:34)

“Now is the time for Congress to act, to pass humane legislation that will make the provisions of DACA law, and provide a way for these men, women and children, who are very much a part of the fabric of our country, our neighbors, co-workers, fellow parishioners and friends to continue their lives as productive and valued members of our country. We must always remember, as Jesus told us, that laws were made to serve people, people were not made to serve laws.” - Timothy Cardinal Dolan, Statement on DACA September 5, 2017

The Staten Island Vicariate, standing in solidarity with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and our own Archbishop Timothy Cardinal Dolan, urge our elected officials to support the passage of the bi-partisan DREAM Act of 2017 (Senate Bill 1516 and House Bill HR 3440), an humane legislative act, that will make the provisions of DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) into law and will provide a pathway for citizenship for the more than 800,000 undocumented young immigrants who entered this country as infants and children and who have known no other country than these United States as their own.

These young people attend our schools – both public and Catholic, they pledge allegiance to our American flag and most importantly, they are active members of our congregations and parishes and the future leaders of our churches, mosques, synagogues and our civic community.

The current DREAM Act requires these young people to be free from serious misdemeanors and all felony crimes, attend at least two years of college or serve in the U>S> military and to be subject to 8 years of provisional residency prior to being granted permanent residency status.

We urge our Congressman Donovan, our Senators Schumer and Gillibrand to act courageously and urgently to secure the passage of the bi – partisan DREAM Act currently before Congress, prior to the end of the DACA Executive Order
