FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this passage, Job laments the drudgery and pain all people sometimes experience in life. He talks of troubled days and restless nights. But he does mention that the days move along swiftly, which can remind us that our time here is quite limited and should be well spent.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul explains to the Corinthians that he has no choice but must preach the gospel. He tells of making himself all things to all people, in order to save some of them. He reminds them that he does this willingly, in the hope of sharing in the blessings of the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon and Andrew's mother of a fever, then others with illnesses or demons came to see him. He cured those who were ill and cast out the demons of the others. Then he went off and prayed alone until his followers sought him out. Jesus and his disciples then moved on to other villages to proclaim the good news.

From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I always believe that sorrow shared is sorrow diminished and happiness shared is happiness doubled. I have experienced it many a time assisting in illness, deathbeds, funerals, and struggles of our life among our parishioners. This time I am the recipient of this kindness. All of you were so kind to me through your kind words of comfort, Masses and prayers at the loss of my youngest brother on 11th January. I am so grateful to all of you.

My brother, Most Rev. Francis Kalist and I have originally planned to have a consultation with specialists in New Delhi Medical Institute on 10th of February for liver transplant or any further treatment and celebrate a healing Mass for him on February 11th at the Shrine of Our Lady of Graces in my brother's diocese. I had booked a flight for it in October itself. After his passing last month my bishop brother told me not to cancel it and join him at the Shrine of Our Lady of Graces to offer Mass for the repose of his soul, blessings for his wife & children and pray for healing for many of our ailing parishioners. This year, since this feast falls on a Sunday we will not have the annual healing Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes. But be sure that I will offer Mass for all our ailing parishioners on the feast day. The next day I will be back to Queen of Peace.

I have developed a habit of reading first the back cover of a book before I read it. When the chapel missalettes arrived for this season I looked at the back of it and found this quote from our Holy Father's Angelus Address on August 16th, 2015, "**The Eucharist is not a private prayer or a beautiful spiritual exercise. The Eucharist is Jesus himself who gives himself entirely to us. Nourishing ourselves of that "Bread of Life" means entering into harmony with the heart of Christ, assimilating his choices, his thoughts, his behavior. It means entering into a dynamism of love and becoming people of peace, people of forgiveness, of reconciliation, of sharing in solidarity.**" How profound it is! This is what we do Sunday after Sunday when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist as our spiritual obligation to nurture our faith and grow in union with Christ our Lord and Savior. Do we realize it?
