TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. When he begged for mercy, Abraham reminded him that Lazarus had lived in torment, while the rich man lived in selfish luxury. The man then asked if Lazarus could be sent to his brothers to warn them. But Abraham said if they had not heeded Moses or the prophets, they would ignore even the warning of one risen from the dead.

From the Pastor's Desk ...

The main theme of this Sunday's readings is the warning that the selfish and extravagant use of God's blessings, like wealth, without sharing them with the poor and the needy is a serious sin deserving eternal punishment. Today's readings stress the Covenant responsibility of the rich for the poor, reminding us of the truth that wealth without active mercy for the poor is great wickedness.

Very important feasts will be occurring in the coming week: Tuesday, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, Wednesday, The Holy Guardian Angels, and on Friday, First Friday, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. A traditional pet blessing will take place here at 4:30pm, in the parking lot.

Also on this coming First Friday at our 7 pm healing Mass, we will pray especially for all those struggling with cancer. If you or anyone you know is going through treatment or remission, please come and participate as we pray for the intercession of St. Pellegrino, the patron saint of cancer patients.

To those who have mornings free, I humbly encourage you to participate in daily Mass, to bless ourselves and all our dear ones invoking Jesus' love and peace receiving Him in Holy Communion.

Thank you to all who organized and participated in the donut Sunday after Mass. This is a joyful way to meet and greet and grow in Christian fellowship. As you are seated in the Church, say a little prayer for those celebrating the Mass with you, especially those who are in your pew. It will bring heavenly joy to your heart and divine blessings to all in our Church.

This free course is offered in English and Spanish and may be accessed from the Liturgy Office webpage and nyliturgy.teachable.com. This program is intended to standardize the material received by ministers throughout the Archdiocese. After finishing this

course the student will receive a certificate of completion via email. The minister then presents this certificate to the pastor. All Ministers and prospective Ministers are encouraged to obtain this training and certificate.

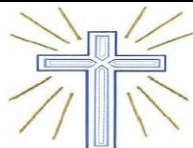
