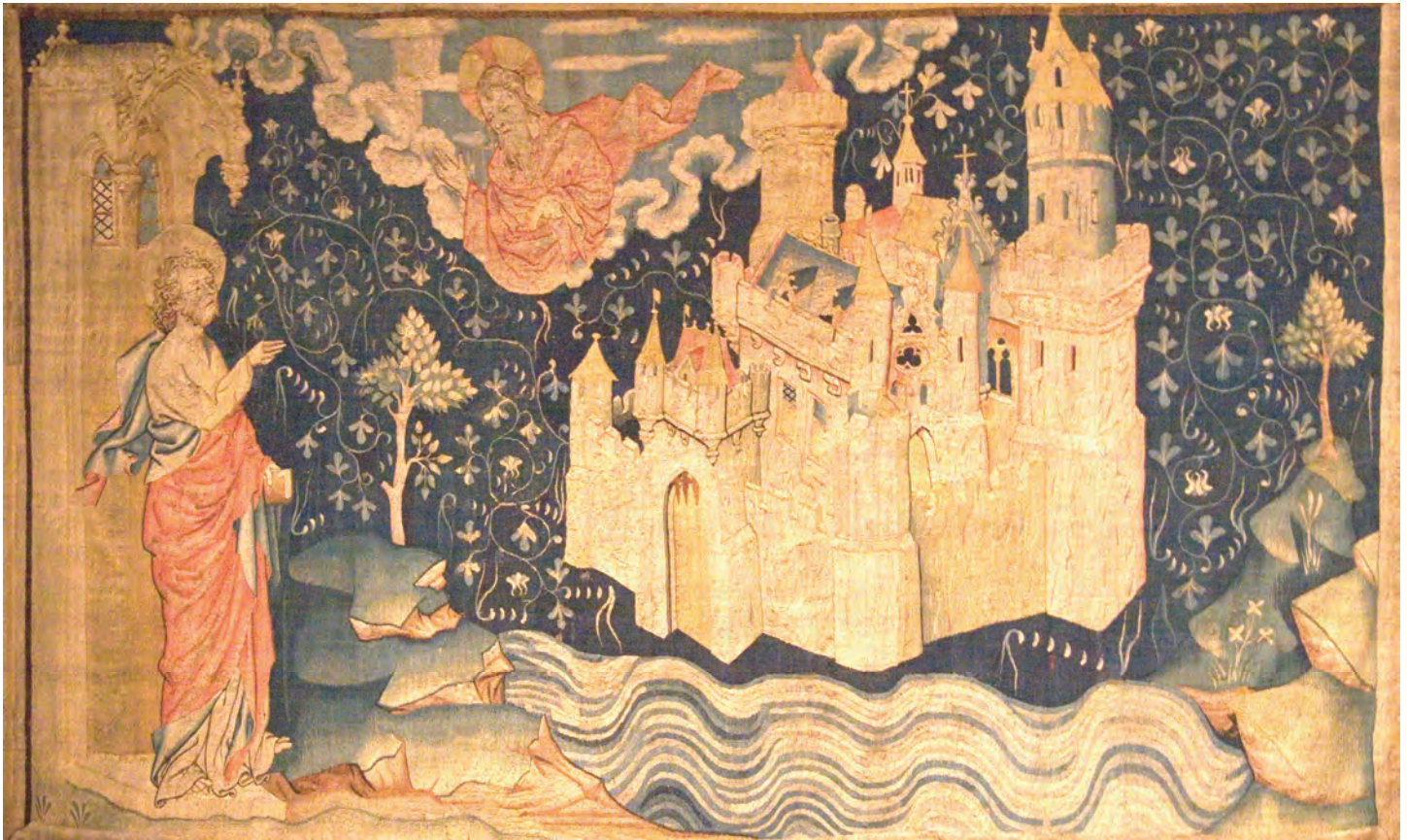

## Sacrament of Baptism

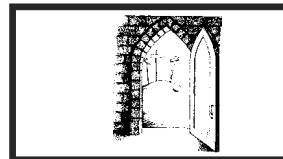

Two weeks ago, St. John School had its annual sports awards banquet. The guest speaker was alumnus Michael Weiss, who has graciously agreed to allow his speech to be printed (below). Once you read it, I think you'll understand why I wanted to share it.

I heard St. John's had quite a successful year in sports. Congratulations! From all the games this season, I'm sure many of you know the OCPSL pledge that is recited before every game. It goes:

*"I pledge myself, on my honor, to be loyal to my God, to my church, and to my country. I resolve to live a clean and honest life, and to fulfill all my duties as a Christian. I pledge myself to promote by word and example, clean and wholesome recreation. I resolve to be in all things a gracious loser and a generous winner."*

My name is Michael Weiss, and I'm a 2012 graduate of St. John's. I remember often being anxious to start my basketball games, and not realizing how important this pledge really is. The words of the pledge have had a special meaning to me throughout high school, and have helped make me the person I am today. I'm currently a senior at Goshen Central High School and I can't believe that I'll be graduating in only four months. I'm nervous but also excited to go off to college and begin the next chapter of my life. As I look ahead and wonder about the next four years, I still often reflect on the many positive influences I have had to this point in my life. Participating in the OCPSL and attending St. John's are definitely two of those influences - teaching me the importance of sportsmanship, teamwork, responsibility, leadership, and helping others. These values have helped me since my time at St. John's and will continue to guide me throughout college and throughout my life as a Catholic.

During my time at St. John's, I was on many suc-

cessful basketball teams, including an undefeated championship team my 8<sup>th</sup> grade year. Every year, my team was good enough to beat opposing teams by significant margins. However, our coaches wouldn't let this happen - they taught us how to show respect, be team players, and show good sportsmanship. As I've gone on in my athletic career, I've come to admire this sportsmanship even more. Over the years, I've been a part of many AAU and high school games where a team has won by as many as seventy points. ## BIBLE BASICS 11: GIVING THE COVENANT

After three months of travelling in the desert, after their escape from the Egyptians, the Israelites come upon Mount Sinai and pitch camp. This is the same mountain where Moses, in Exodus 3, had seen the burning bush and received his call to save his people. Now, back on this very mountain, he is to give the people what they need to sustain this new life of freedom, the law.

God has given the freedom and now he is giving the means to live out that freedom. In both cases, it is only Moses who interacts directly with God. The people are at a distance. In fact, three times does God warn the people not to approach, lest they die.

First, God tells the people through Moses that they are his chosen people. His language is both exalted and

tender: “You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself. Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.” Saint Peter quotes these last lines as fulfilled in the Church through Christ Jesus (I Peter 2:9).

Despite the Lord’s warm condescension, he warns them not to look upon him. First, he tells the people not to touch the mountain itself (Exodus 19:12-13). After he descends in fire, he warns them again (Ex 19:21). God then gives the Ten Commandments, which is the heart of his covenant (Ex 20:1-17). By this time, the people themselves are terrified of the display God has made and ask Moses to be their mediator (Ex 20:19). Moses does this, and he interprets God’s actions for them: this display of his power is meant to keep them from sin.

God makes such a display of himself, in fire and smoke, and he warns the people not to make idols. No human undertaking can compare with God’s power – and no idol can achieve what God has, condescending to dwell with the human race and the Jewish people in particular (Ex 20:22-23). This is the context for God’s giving of the law, which he continues to do in very specific terms in Exodus 21–23. God must dwell among a people who behaves as he does.

In this moment of lawgiving, God reveals his greater plan. He speaks of an angel who will go before the Israelites, driving out their enemies from the land (Ex 23:20-33). He says, “My name is within him.” This is a mysterious saying, though we can understand it to be Joshua, whose name includes the name of the Lord. Joshua is the one through whom God clears out the land of Canaan for the Israelites.

The name Joshua is also rendered as Jesus. Jesus is the one who, 1400 years later, definitively clears the way for our new freedom and the new law that accompanies us into the kingdom of heaven. With him the fear of the Lord takes the shape of the Cross, the true beginning of wisdom. In him, we have seen the face of God and have lived.
