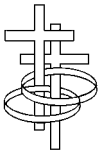

This brings us to a related topic of which I have spoken somewhat frequently: the fostering of vocations to the priesthood. There was a time when it was considered quite special – even something of an honor – for a family to yield a new priest or a religious sister or brother. Today, though, the common perception seems to be that “priests come from someone else’s family, not mine.” There are probably many reasons for that – so many, in fact, that I won’t even attempt to enumerate them here. But the happy fact is that there *are* men, young and old, who see the priesthood as a good, as something for which the sacrifice is a small price to pay for the blessings that may come from it. In fact, we have several young men right in our parish whom Fr. Peter and I believe would make fine priests. In some cases, we’ve openly talked about it; in others, we still pray to our Heavenly Father in secret for them. But the common denominator is *families that are willing to nurture and foster those vocations.*

To the best of my knowledge, it’s been twenty years since a priest came from the fold of St. John’s (Fr. John Fraser, ordained in May 1996; he’s the pastor of Holy Rosary Parish in Hawthorne). If we pray and work together to foster the priestly vocations in our midst, we won’t have to wait another twenty years!

BIBLE BASICS 20: KING SOLOMON AND THE DIVIDED KINGDOM (I AND II KINGS)

King David is not very attentive in his old age, and the prophet Nathan, through whom God had promised that David’s son would succeed him, must once again manipulate things so as to have Solomon on the throne. He has Bathsheba, Solomon’s mother, speak to David about Adonijah, an usurper, right before he himself does (I Kings 1). After David’s death, Solomon secures his kingship with a relatively small amount of bloodshed (I K 2).

Solomon’s success, rather, comes through intermarriage and treaties. He marries the daughter of Pharaoh – Egypt has a long tradition of wisdom literature – and asks the Lord for wisdom, for which he becomes renowned.

This explains the long-standing tradition that Solomon is the author of Proverbs and most of the wisdom books in the Bible, including some psalms. I Kings also portrays him as a kind of scientist (I K 4:1–5:14). Having built a peaceable kingdom, and having established a treaty for supplies from Tyre (in what is now Lebanon), Solomon builds the temple (I K 5:15–8:66). The temple becomes the symbol of God’s protection, and indeed the place of his presence among the Israelites (8:10-13).

The Lord places a condition on his presence in the temple. It is characteristic of Deuteronomistic theology, which is found from Deuteronomy to II Kings, as well as in Jeremiah and some psalms, that the security of the temple depends upon the fidelity of the king and his subjects (9:1-9). God promises, as he did to David, that a descendant of Solomon will always reign; the temple and even the land, though, God has not promised forever. This threat will soon come to fruition.

It is soon after God’s threat against the temple and the land that Solomon and his successors begin to sin. Solomon, for all his wisdom, turns to sins of the flesh with his many wives, and through them, to idolatry (I K 11). After Solomon’s death, the kingdom divides into north (Israel) and south (Judah). The rest of I and II Kings chronicles the acts of these kings. Some, like Hezekiah and Josiah, bring about real religious reform (II Kings 18–20 and 22–23). Nevertheless, the kingdoms move toward disintegration as first Israel is conquered by Assyria and then Judah by Babylon, which destroys the temple and takes its noble and educated classes

into the captivity known as the Babylonian Exile (587-523 BC).

As the kings grow idolatrous and corrupt, the prophets arise. Elijah and his disciple Elisha perform great miracles in witness to faith in the one true God of Israel (I K 17–II K 13). Isaiah helps Hezekiah in his reforms (II K 19–20). Indeed, with the loss of the kingdoms altogether, it is the prophets who rule the Israelites in faithfulness to God. After the exile, under Persian rule, the priests govern the people of what becomes the region of Judea. The books of I and II Chronicles, Ezra, and Nehemiah describe this time period (the 5th and 4th centuries BC). It is under foreign domination and governance by the priests that the Judaism of Jesus’ day and beyond takes shape.
