Current Guidelines:

1. Sunday and Holy Day Mass Obligation in effect.
2. People are strongly encouraged to return but should consider their health and situation in deciding.
3. **Masks no longer required** - unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing face covering, keeping social distancing.
4. No church capacity restrictions.
5. **Social Distancing** - a "physical distance section" will be maintained for those individuals who wish to utilize such accommodations regardless of their vaccination status.
6. Attendees may continue to sanitize hands at sanitizer station at doors
7. Holy water fonts will remain empty.
8. All social gatherings remain suspended including coffee after French Mass.
9. Sign of peace offered with or without physical contact.
10. It is recommended that Holy Communion continue to be received in the hand.
11. Collections take place but parishioners are urged to use *WeShare*.

St. John XXIII, Pope

Born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli in northern Italy, in 1881, the fourth in a family of 14. In 1892, he entered the seminary where he began the practice of writing spiritual notes, which he continued until his death and these have been gathered together in the *Journal of a Soul*. Ordained a priest in 1904, he served in WWI in the medical corps and was also chaplain. When the war ended, he opened a "Student House" for the spiritual needs of young people. He was National Director for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith and diplomat to Bulgaria, Turkey & France. During WWII He helped to save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people. Roncalli was elected Pope in 1958, taking the name John XXIII. His Encyclicals *Pacem in terris* and *Mater et Magistra* was deeply appreciated. He convoked the Roman Synod, established the Commission for the Revision of the Code of Canon Law and summoned the Second Vatican Council. The faithful saw in him a reflection of the goodness of God and called him "the good Pope." Pope John XXIII died in 1963 and canonized in 2014.

St. Teresa of Jesus

Born in Avila, Spain in 1515 and at eighteen she joined the Carmelite Order. With St. John of the Cross, she reformed most of the Carmelite convents and founded new houses for Carmelite nuns and friars, who were known as "Discalced" ("barefooted" or wore sandals). Through prayer she obtained a high degree of knowledge of Divine things and wrote great works of asceticism and mysticism. St. Teresa's body remains incorrupt and her heart, which is on display, shows signs of piercing of the heart or transverberation. Pope Paul VI named St. Teresa the first woman Doctor of the Church. She is patron against headaches, heart disease, of those who have lost parents, and of Spain.

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME -The "spirit of Wisdom," extolled so beautifully by Solomon in today's first reading (Wis.7: 7-11), is not just intellectual understanding, but a whole philosophy of life. Biblically, wisdom is real insight into life, the discernment required to live life well. This Wisdom, which is a gift from God, is at the heart of human existence, so basic that "all good things" come together with her and nothing is more precious. "All gold, in view of her, is a little sand." The rich man in St. Mark's gospel (Mk 10:17-30) is apparently sincere enough. When Jesus offers him the commandments as a pattern of life, the man assures him that he has been observing them since childhood. It is Jesus' directive that he divests himself of everything; that is the rich man's stumbling block. Jesus then reminds His followers, and us, that being too caught up in possessions and wealth can distract us from the real values of a committed life. It is our attitude that is important, and for the wealthy that means a spirit of detachment from their riches, as well as a willingness to share with those in need. To emphasize this point, our second reading from the letter to the Hebrews, (Heb.4; 12-13) reminds us that nothing is hidden from God. Whatever our status or resources, each of us is responsible for what we have been given and will one day have to render an account of our stewardship.
