Our Patron Saint



San Ysidro, born in Madrid, Spain in 1070 is the patron saint of farmers, of Madrid, of the village of Corrales, and of this parish church. He was a hired hand who had an extraordinary ability to pray directly to God who was so pleased that He sent an angel into San Ysidro's field, to do his work, freeing him to pray even more. He is said to have performed many miracles during his life and despite his own poverty, shared what little he had with the poor. He died on May 15, 1130 and was canonized in 1622. He was married to Maria Torribia, also honored as a saint under the name of Santa Maria de la Cabeza. A parish fiesta is held every year on a weekend close to his May 15 feast day.

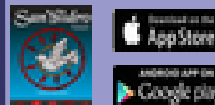

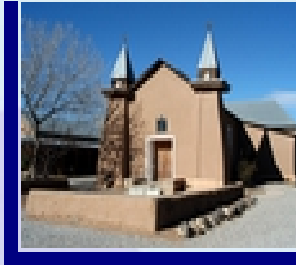

The First Catholic Church

in Corrales was a mission built around 1750 near the river and was dedicated to the Holy Family. Priests came from Sandia Pueblo for Masses and the sacraments until 1857 when the priests from Our Lady of Sorrows Church in Bernalillo took over. This first church was washed away in a flood in 1868.



The next church, now known as the "Old Historic Church," was also a mission and was built in 1869 on Old Church Road by the parishioners and was dedicated to San Ysidro.



A new church, again dedicated to San Ysidro, was built by volunteers in 1961 and 1962 on Corrales Road and became a full-fledged parish church serving the Village of Corrales' Catholics in 1966.

In 2012 plans were made to expand the church capacity from 324 to 512 persons. Construction started in September, 2012, and In May 2013 the remodeling was finished. Transepts have been added on either side of the main altar so that the church now has the traditional cruciform shape. The narthex in the rear houses a bride's room, restrooms, and an indoor gathering space.

The San Ysidro Parish grounds include the Religious Ed. Building (classrooms behind the church), the office, the rectory, and Hendren Hall. A Memorial Garden for the Unborn, dedicated in 2008, is on the east side of Hendren Hall. It features a sculpture of Our Lady of Guadalupe and is a place to pray any time of day or night.



## Sacraments

**Baptism:** Sundays after the 11:00 am Mass, or by appointment. Pre-Baptism instructions for parents and sponsors are on the first Sunday of each month at 1:00 pm in the Religious Ed. Building. Registration at the parish office is required.



**Matrimony:** Arrangements must be made at the parish office at least 6 months prior to the date of the wedding.

**Penance:** Saturdays – 3:00 to 4:30 pm. Other times upon request.

**Communion to Homebound:** Call the parish office.

**First Confession:** Second grade children make their First Confession in the spring.

**First Holy Communion:** Third grade children receive their First Holy Communion in the spring after Easter.

**Confirmation:** Anyone who is baptized and is a high school freshman or older is eligible to be confirmed.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is administered on first Saturdays in the church after the 8:30 am Mass and at other times, as needed, upon request.

## Faith Formation Program

### Religious Education for the Youth:

Kindergarten through ninth grade classes are held on Wednesdays, September to May. K - 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes are held from 4:30 pm to 5:45 pm. 6<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> grade classes are held from 6 pm to 7:15 pm. The 9<sup>th</sup> grade class is the Confirmation class. For details, contact Ken Cantwell, Director of Religious Instruction, at 505-620-3675.



**RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults):** This is a year long program that prepares non-baptized and baptized adult candidates to enter fully into the life of the Catholic Church. Candidates completing the program receive their sacraments during the Easter Vigil Mass. Classes are free and usually are held on Sundays beginning in September. Contact the parish office for additional information.

## Liturgical Groups

**Altar Servers:** Adults and children who have received their First Holy Communion are eligible to assist at Mass. Call the parish office for more information.

## Devotions and More



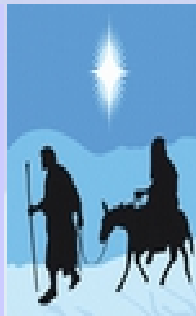
**Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament:** is on every Friday (except for Good Friday). Adoration is after the 6:30 am Mass with Benediction at 5:00 pm. During Lent, Benediction is right after the Stations of the Cross which begin at 6:00 pm.

**Chaplets of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Seven Joys of St. Joseph:** Wednesdays after the 6:30 am Mass.

**Rosary for the Unborn:** Saturdays after the 8:30 am Mass and also a half hour before the Saturday Vigil Mass.

**Stations of the Cross:** Lenten Fridays at 6:00 pm.

**Christmas Novena:** The traditional New Mexican re-enactment of Mary's and Joseph's search for shelter on Christmas eve has been either a Christmas Novena with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction or the traditional New Mexican Las Posadas at various parishioners' homes. This observance takes place every early evening before Christmas starting on December 16 with the very last observance preceding the Christmas Vigil Mass. ## Knights of Columbus, Council #14999

The Knights meet on the first Thursday at 7:00 pm in Hendren Hall. They support the church, community and each other, through works, donations, and spiritual growth. San Ysidro's Knights feed the poor and house the homeless by giving time and money to St. Felix Pantry and Little Brothers of the Good Shepherd. The Knights actively oppose abortion and support mothers in need and their babies. They support our parish's seminarians and U.S. military chaplains, raise funds for the parish, and participate annually in Special Olympics. On the third Saturdays, the Knights sponsor a Bingo Night with refreshments in Hendren Hall immediately following the end of the 5 pm vigil Mass. Bingo proceeds support the Knights' ministries.



## San Ysidro Ladies Sodality

Parish women meet on the first Wednesday at 1 pm in Hendren Hall occasionally with an optional lunch at noon. They serve at funeral receptions, sponsor an annual warm clothing drive for local charities, and provide welcome packets for parish newcomers. They offer spiritual and social events for all parish women. Their bake and yard sale proceeds benefit the entire parish and/or support other charitable organizations. 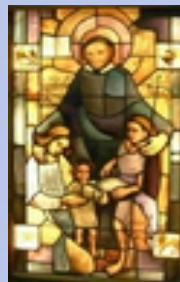
## Fiesta Committee

An ad hoc Fiesta Committee plans a grand, festive commemoration each year on a weekend close to May 15 (San Ysidro's Feast Day). A special Sunday Fiesta Mass is often celebrated outside on the Old Historic Church porch with a procession honoring San Ysidro with Matachines (ritual dancers from Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Bernalillo) leading up to a lavish celebration on the parish grounds. It is a weekend filled with music, crafts, dancing, games, good food, and lots of comradeship. Parishioners are encouraged to fully participate in the fiesta and to volunteer for their favorite fiesta activity.



## Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP)

The SVdP meets on the second Thursday at 6:30 pm in Hendren Hall. There is also a spiritual meeting on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday starting with the 6:30 am Mass with breakfast afterwards. Their monthly collection on the first Sunday is used to help those in need within the Corrales and San Ysidro boundaries.
