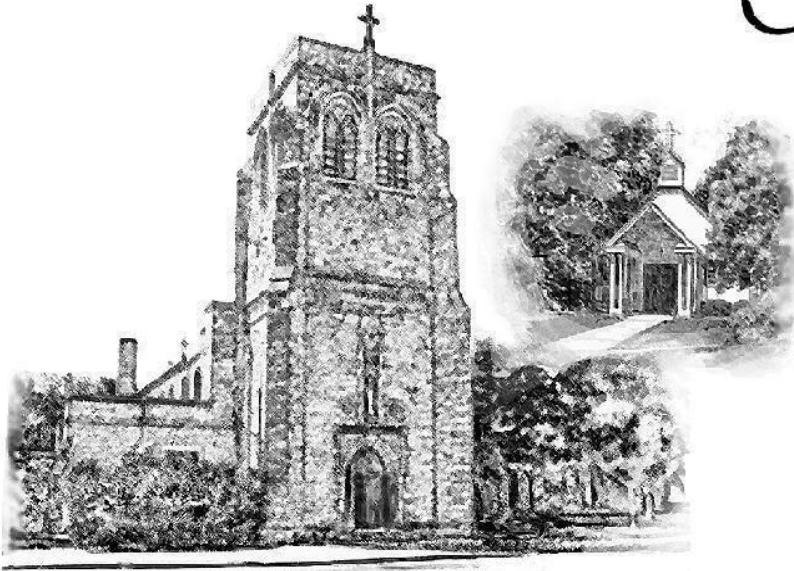

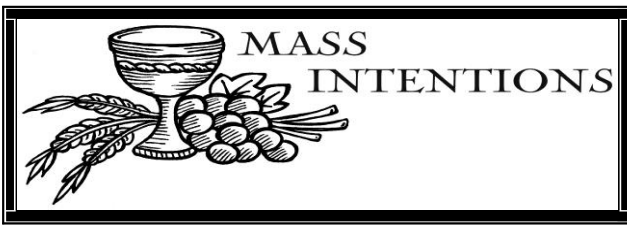

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

So thank you to all who volunteered to speak in their native tongues, and in a special way to Dagmar Simons for coordinating this for all of the Masses. Thanks also to the musicians and singers of the Music ministry for making this 'birthday of the Church' so special. As always, thanks to our servers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and ushers for their contributions, as well as to Marjorie Gilbert for all of the 'behind-the-scenes' work she does to make the sanctuary 'liturgically proper'. It takes many hands to make a beautiful liturgy, so again, thank you all!

Monday is Memorial Day and many people have a long weekend. For many, it is considered the beginning of the summer season, a time to break out the grill, to party, to kick back into another gear. This is all fine and nice, but have we forgotten what the real meaning of Memorial Day is? It is a time to remember and pray for all those who have given their lives in the service of our country, who have made the ultimate sacrifice so that we can enjoy the freedoms we have. Following the 5:00pm Saturday evening Mass, we will have a procession around the inside of the church, followed by the Litany of the Sacred Heart and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please plan on coming and honoring Our Eucharistic Lord through this special devotion.

This will be my last weekly letter for the summer. If something comes up, I will write a short letter, but on the whole, you are free of my blathering to enjoy this wonderful season. I sincerely hope that you use this time for to help restore yourselves after having been worn down by so much winter and such a rainy spring. WEEKDAY MASSES ##

Beginning on Monday June 4th, there will be **ONE weekday Mass (Monday through Friday) celebrated at the Chapel of the Good Shepherd at 12:00 NOON.**

Also that week, beginning on Saturday June 9th, **Saturday morning Mass will be at 9AM at the Chapel**

WEEKEND MASSES

Beginning Saturday June 9, the 5:00 pm will be moved to the Chapel.

The Sunday Masses

Beginning on Sunday June 10, we will NOT be combining the 8:00am and 9:15am Masses

The Sunday Masses will NOT change for the summer.

Mass at 8AM & 10:45 at the Church

9:15 & 11AM at the Chapel of the Good Shepherd

Combined Masses: * On June 17, July 15, August 19, the 10:45 Mass and 11:00 Mass will be combined into a **BI-LINGUAL 10:45 Mass in the Church**

These changes will be continued through the summer and until further notice.
