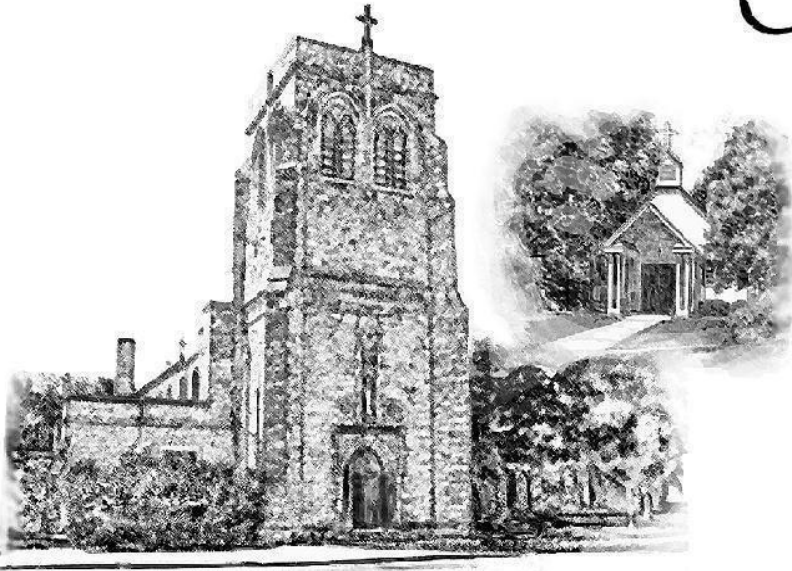

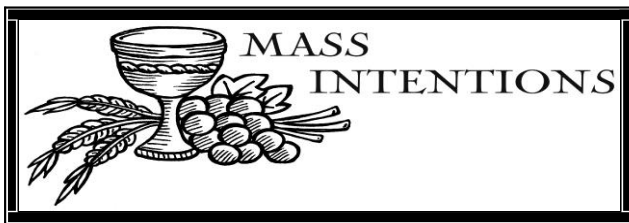

Welcome to the 2018-19 CYO Basketball Season. CYO Basketball Registration is now open. All of registration this year is online at hnmcroton.com. Parishioner boys and girls registered in CCD at Holy Name from third through eight grades are eligible to participate. Space is limited. To be guaranteed a spot to play, we need you to be registered by Monday August 27th. Practices start in mid-October. Games start in mid-November and go through mid-February. For a player enrolled in CCD at Holy Name, the cost for CYO basketball is \$185 per player plus uniform costs. For the non-CCD parishioner and non-parishioner cost is \$265.00 plus uniform costs but only if there are openings. Why Be Catholic ? (2)

St. Teresa of Avila said that we are the only hands and feet God has in this world today. What we say and do may be the only way others come to know God. Rather than leaving us alone to do His work, Jesus founded a Church so we can work together.

Besides our need for a spiritual community there are four other reasons we need a church.

It can:

- 1) Provide sacred rituals, worship, and symbols
- 2) Communicate and explain God's revealed Word
- 3) Be a source of moral teaching
- 4) Provide guidance for our relationship with God

Three other Catholic doctrines disputed by Protestants (even though there are thousands of documented miracles associated with them) are:

- 1) Mary's supreme intercession
- 2) The intercession of the saints
- 3) The real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

So the question arises, why do Catholics pray to Mary?

Catholics do not:

- 1) Worship Mary
- 2) Believe she is a goddess
- 3) Believe she can perform miracles on her own

Catholics pray to Mary for two reasons:

First, if believers ask others (on Earth) to pray for them, why wouldn't they ask Mary (in Heaven) to also pray for them?

Second, as the human mother of Jesus, she has a unique place in his heart. He did it when he was on this earth when He turned water

into wine at her request. As proof of God's response to Mary's intercession, there are countless accounts of apparitions and miracles associated with her throughout history.

Catholics also pray to Saints, asking them to intercede to God for them. There are many medically confirmed miracles (by scientific standards) connected to the intercession of Saints.

In fact, for a person to be declared a Saint, two verified miracles are required after their death (one for beatification, and the other for canonization—being declared a saint), a process that takes several years.
