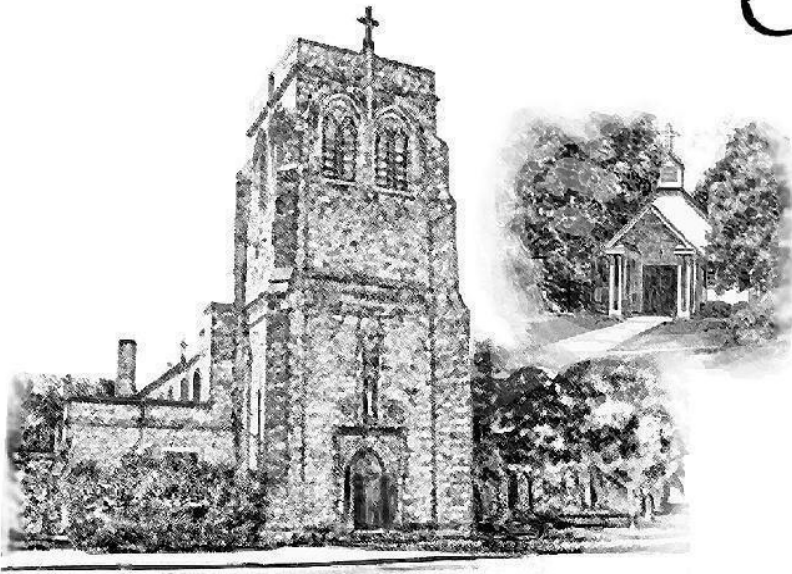

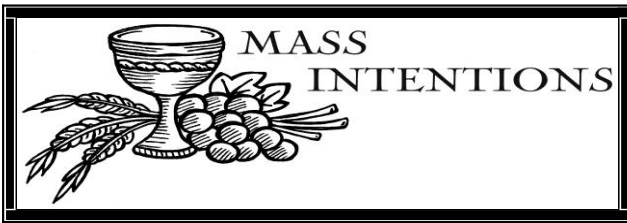

Welcome to the 2018-19 CYO Basketball Season.

CYO Basketball Registration is now open.

All of registration this year is online at

hnmcroton.com.

Parishioner boys and girls registered in CCD at Holy Name from third through eight grades are eligible to participate. **Space is limited. To be guaranteed a spot to play, we need you to be registered by Monday August 27th.**

Practices start in mid-October. Games start in mid-November and go through mid-February.

For a player enrolled in CCD at Holy Name, the cost for CYO basketball is \$185 per player plus uniform costs. For the non-CCD parishioner and non-parishioner cost is \$265.00 plus uniform costs but only if there are openings. Why Be Catholic ? 4

Qualifying for Communion

For Catholics, Communion is an essential part of the Mass. You must, among other requirements, be of Catholic Faith, receive a welcome into the church, and be in a state of grace to take Communion.

1. Become Catholic. Baptized children go through the process in Religious Education programs in their local parishes, adults will undergo a group class called RCIA and go through the process of Reconciliation, first Communion, and Confirmation to convert to Catholicism.
2. Receive a welcome into the church. Each church has its own welcoming ritual. Speak to the priest or to another church leader about the welcoming process. You must be formally received by the church before you can take Communion. If you are a practicing Catholic who simply changed churches, the priest may wish to speak with you to see if you have been baptized, go to Confession, and have received your first Communion and Confirmation.
3. Accept Communion in a state of grace. The Eucharist may not be received while in person has mortal sin in their soul. If you have committed a grave sin such as theft, adultery, or other, you must go to Reconciliation and repent before receiving Communion.
4. Believe in the doctrine of Transubstantiation. This means that the bread and wine are actually transformed into the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ. The offerings only appear as bread and wine but are believed to actually be the Presence of Christ Himself.
5. Participate in the Eucharistic fast. This means you cannot eat or drink anything for at least one hour before taking Communion. Water and medicine are excluded from the fast. Those who are elderly or ill are excused from fasting.

Receiving Communion

1. Go to Mass. You will take Communion during Mass. Prepare yourself both mentally and spiritually during the Consecration of the Eucharist to participate in Communion. You can do this by giving your thanks, appreciation, and reverence to Jesus Christ through prayer.
2. Approach the altar. The priests and other Ministers will prepare to give Communion by taking their usual places. Wait for the usher to guide your row to walk up.
3. Receive the Host. Depending on the church and your personal preference, you can either have the host fed to you or handed to you. In the traditional Rite the host is fed to you. Open your mouth and extend your tongue so that the Host does not fall. The Host will be placed on your tongue. Close your mouth and allow the host to dissolve on your tongue while thinking of the sacrifice made. If you wish to have the host handed to you, hold out your hands, left on top of the right. Do not take the host from the priest, the priest will say "the Body of Christ," and you should respond "Amen."
4. Receive the Blood. After receiving the host you will receive the blood. Allow the host to dissolve while you are waiting your turn. Take a small drink from the chalice that is offered to you. The person offering the cup will say "the Blood of Christ" and you should respond "Amen."
5. Walk back to your seat and kneel. This is a time for you to reflect and thank Jesus for coming to you in the Holy Eucharist. Return to your pew and pray, until the priest is finished offering the Blessed Sacrament.
