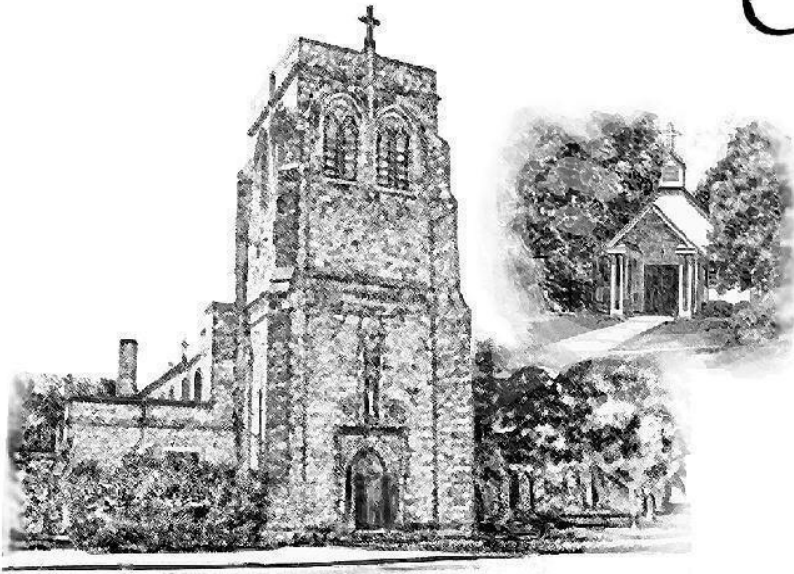

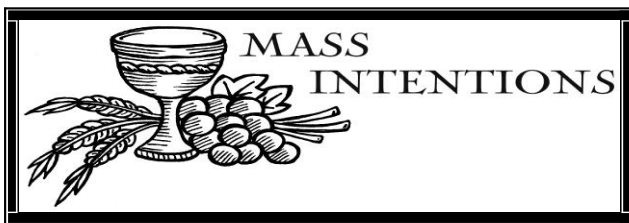

From the Parish House

13 January 2019

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It marks the beginning of the public life of Jesus and His embracing of His mission of preaching and teaching, culminating in His great sacrifice on the cross. It serves as a reminder to us of our own Baptism and our incorporation into the Body of Christ, the Church. It also reminds us that as Christians we share in the mission of the Christ, and are called to be instruments of the Lord in the continuing work of salvation. We are integral in the Lord's plan to establish His kingdom here on earth. Although we may not be able to do much about things on the world stage, we can, should, and must do something about those things closer to home about which we *can* effect a change. As we bring in this new year, we can help bring the peace of the Prince of Peace into our world in a myriad of little ways. We can and must witness to the sanctity of all human life, from the moment of conception to the point of natural death. Even in these bleak economic times, we can still contribute to a charity or food pantry to help those who are in even worse shape than we. Something as simple as refusing to participate in gossip can help make things more tranquil, since the maliciousness of most gossip seriously undermines the very fabric of our community, often causing division, suspicion and unjust mischaracterizations of people and/or events. In these, and in so many other ways, we fulfill our Baptismal promises to 'hear the word of God and to proclaim it' by what we say and do, and in doing so help to make our lives and the lives of others better. To not do so means that we are contributing to the mess. Remember the adage: "If you are not part of the solution, you are part of the problem!"

As you may or may not know, we have instituted a 9:00am Sunday Mass on those Sundays on which our Religious Education Program meets. We have not 'advertised' it, since it is intended as a teaching Mass for the children and their parents. The children participate in various ways, such as doing the readings, writing the general intercessions, and taking up the collection. Everybody is welcome to this Mass, so please do not feel excluded, or think we are trying to hide this Mass from the community. Our intention and focus is on educating both children and their parents about the Mass and thus to help them participate in a more meaningful and fruitful way.

This coming Tuesday, January 15th, we will have a special 'town hall meeting' for the presentation of our yearly financial report. In the past we have made the presentation in place of the homily at Sunday Mass, but that did not allow time for questions. So the Finance Council will make the presentation at 7:00pm in the church, using visuals and allow time for questions. All are invited and encouraged to attend.

A parting chuckle: In this day and age of voice mail, electronic messaging and all the rest, did you ever wonder what it would be like if God used the same technology? Knights of Columbus Free Throw Contest - Friday, January 18th

All boys and girls ages 9 to 14 are invited to participate in the 2019 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship. The local competition will be held on Friday, January 18, 2019, at 6:00 p.m., at the James R. Moore Gym of Holy Name of Mary Church.

The Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship is sponsored annually with winners progressing through local, district, and state competition. International champions are announced by the K of C international headquarters based on scores from the state-level competitions. All boys and girls 9 to 14 years old are eligible to participate and will compete in respective age divisions. Last year more than 120,000 sharpshooters participated in over 3,600 local competitions.

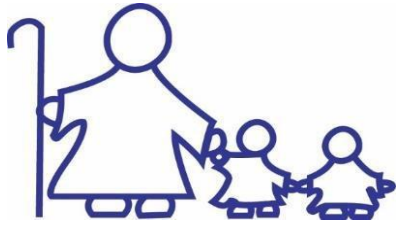
Please support this ministry which supports 3rd world farmers.
