Since you have graduated from James L. Collins Catholic School what academic, career, and/or volunteer paths have you taken? What is your current job title and company?

After I graduated from Collins Catholic School, I completed my high school education at Corsicana High School. I then completed my Associate and Bachelor degrees in Business Administration and Information Technology at AIU, and I received a Master of Accounting degree from Drake University. I have spent my career primarily in the information technology and financial fields and have worked for some of the largest public and private companies in the world including Wells Fargo, Capital One, ADP, Xerox, KPMG, and PwC. Today, I am a Vice President for Wells Fargo focusing on compliance and operational risk for the CCS division which contains areas such as credit cards, home loans, student loans, and auto loans. I am also part of the faculty at the University of Texas at Arlington and the University of North Texas. I teach technology and accounting courses for their respective College of Business. I have also spent time volunteering at various organizations including the United Way, Junior Achievement of Dallas, ALS Association, and Arthritis Foundation.
