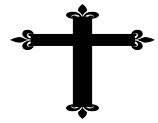

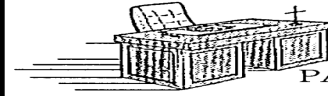

### **Jesus Transforms Water into Wine** (John 2:1-11)

Once the Christmas celebrations are over with the baptism of the Lord, we begin ordinary time. We as baptized are members of the Body of Christ which is the Church. This teaching can be "ordinary", but it is not because through baptism we have been begotten by the spirit. That just as we begin to celebrate Ordinary Time, we are able to understand the extraordinary effects of God's grace.

Today's readings tell us about marvelous events such as the radiance of Jerusalem, the first Christian communities and the gift of tongues and, if not enough, the first miraculous sign of Jesus that transforms water into wine. All these facts the Scriptures invite us to contemplate them as the salvific action of God that protects and is compassionate with his people. So it is worth remembering that since we are sons and daughters of God by baptism, we have a god who is our merciful father and full of mercy for all.

Last week we heard St. Luke recounting the Holy Spirit's descent on Jesus on the day of his baptism. Today St. Paul tells the believers who lived in the community of Corinth that it is the Spirit who is behind the phenomena and charisms that manifest themselves in the community of the first believers. God is behind everything that is new and wonderful as described by today's readings;

Thus, the new names given to Jerusalem, the new wine in Cana of Galilee and the new spiritual gifts manifested in the community of Corinth. With God, not everything is as it always has been done, but "God does all things in a new way". God is recreated in the graces that is given abundantly to his people.

Today's gospel ends with the declaration of St. John who observes that "the disciples began to believe in Him." However, it is curious to note that a person already believed in Him even before executing the miracle; that is, Mary, His Mother. That is why we call Mary the first believer. It is Mary the first to realize that there is no wine and tells her Son.

Although she suffers a slight rejection, Maria is able to insist on her purpose and alert the servers to get in touch with Jesus. This event at the wedding at Cana in Galilee is not only a sign of Jesus' power but also of the customs of human families. Ideally, every mother believes in the abilities of her children and in all the things that they can do. Sons or daughters obey their parents in the best way. The Holy Family is a model for families today.
