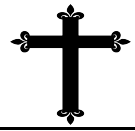

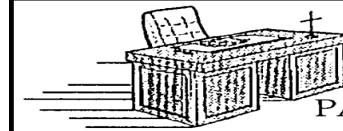

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am a sinner"
(Luke 18:13)

This Sunday the Lord invites us to examine our attitudes when we come to Mass. Are we proud of what we have done this week? Or maybe we feel sorry because we have failed to keep the commandments because of our human weakness? All of us without a doubt are called to examine our consciences and to experience the mercy of God.

The prayers of people in need will ponder the mercy of God who is willing to listen. The attitudes of people who do not want to listen, take us away from the mercy of God. That is why on his recent trip to Africa, Pope Francis reminded us that the rigid are those who are not willing to listen or look at the good things of those who are not like them. The Pope told us that "Also in the Church today there are people who use stiffness to cover their own sins" and asked us to pray for them so that, as St. Paul converted, they follow "the way of meekness of Jesus."

The responsorial psalm acclimates us very well in what the prayer of the believer supposes since it tells us that "God hears the weeping of the poor."

Let us put ourselves in the attitude of the needy, let us go to our own humanity and mourn our own miseries. Let us feel part of that Church that cries out to heaven and asks for mercy from the Lord who is the only one who can give us his mercy. Therefore, let us make prayer an outgoing experience for God and not a collection of the goodness that puffs us up as the Pharisee does. The Pharisee of the Gospel or the "rigid" of today do not realize that we always need God. The tax collector or tax collector for his part implores the mercy of God with blows of chest and lowering his head.

Perhaps the needy, the poor and the oppressed from the first reading are at better conditions to be heard by God because they are able to turn to God. Once again, Pope Francis shows us the consolation that comes from God when after his last trip to Africa he reminded us of the fruits of peace found in the midst of poverty. The Gospel tells us that "everyone who humbles himself will be exalted."
