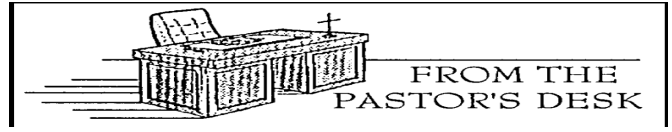

"The Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word." (Acts 10:44)

Today's readings invite us to move from **acceptance to love**. The Easter season and the flourishing of nature remind us that God is love and that his grace "[falls] upon all who [are] listening to the word." The Book of Acts of the Apostles, which is the history of the Early Church, tells us about the wonderful experience that believers of Jewish and Gentile origin experienced: The Spirit was given to everyone equally. That is why Pope Francis teaches us that **with the coming of the Spirit, divisions have ended**.

Love breaks all barriers. Love unites those who did not know each other and fills our lives with happiness.

These statements about the effects of love serve to explain the origin of marital love, but also the maternal love that unites us on earth and prepares us for heavenly joys. That is why those of us who have the joy of having our mothers alive can tell them "Thank you mom for so much love."

It is the unitive experience of love that makes Saint Peter relativize his religious customs and as the keeper of the sheep go to the house of the Gentile Cornelius. Today we would say that Peter **leaves his comfort zone** to enter the ways of God. For Peter it is not a simple entering the house of a Gentile. In the religious context of his time, Peter broke the rules of Jewish purity. The Spirit that is poured out on everyone equally makes Peter not hesitate to preach to those who were considered unclean.

With twenty centuries of Christianity we have advanced a little and Pope Francis pushes us to promote "**the culture of encounter**." All human beings both in the past and in the present have raised barriers of **hatred, separation and violence**. Somehow we have not understood the message of Jesus that is based on the love that he is capable of giving his life for his brothers. The Fifth Sunday of Easter reminds us that **we all have the same Spirit of Jesus** who makes us agents of **love, union and peace**. Therefore, we are all called to add and not subtract in all causes that promote the union and inclusion of those who are different. Others by seeing our good actions and intentions may learn that another world is possible; a world in which the Golden Rule is no longer a mere cliché but a new way of life: "**Love one another as I have loved you**" (John 13:12).
