SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism - First Saturday of the month in English at 1:00 pm. Second Saturday of the month in Spanish at 1:00 PM. Parents must meet with the pastor prior to the Baptism. Patrons and Godparents are required to attend Baptismal instruction. Instruction is held same day as Baptism, prior to ceremony.

Reconciliation - 4:00 PM before the Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

Marriage - Couples are required to make arrangements one year to six months prior to the date of marriage. One party must be a registered and active member of this parish. Participation in Pre-marriage Program is required. Couple must meet with the pastor prior to any arrangements being made.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD MARCH 20, 2016

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes an individual who had been taught by God to reach out to others. He also describes this individual's willingness to be beaten and spit upon, secure that with God's help, he will not be degraded.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul discusses how Jesus did not declare equality with God, but took on human form. He humbled himself enough to accept dying on the cross. God in turn exalted him and wants us to respect Jesus' name and worship him.

Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56

Luke gives a detailed account of Jesus' last supper with the apostles, where Jesus tells them he will soon suffer in fulfillment of God's will. Then Jesus prayed that he might be spared if it suited God's will. After Judas betrayed Jesus, he was arrested. Although Pilate did not think Jesus was guilty of a crime, he gave in to the will of the people, and sentenced Jesus to death on a cross. Then Jesus was crucified and his body laid in a new tomb.

SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Saint Luke sets the scene for us to join Jesus and His followers in their entry to the holy city. Triumph will soon turn to tragedy. The crowd of greeters will quickly depart, and others will take their place. Holy Week is upon us.

We can begin these solemn days, remembering what transpired in Jerusalem. We can approach the Passover meal, observe the washing of the disciples' feet, and the giving of the gift of the Eucharist. We join the disciples in the garden of olives, see the betrayal, hear the denial and the unjust arrest. We will walk the dusty streets to the hill of Calvary, listen to His final words, and quietly leave the guarded tomb.

The events of Holy Week really ask much more of us. We read and listen, we are moved to compassion. But as we walk this week, discover others who are suffering in a similar way. Consider refugees and displaced persons, hear their cry. Consider families of those incarcerated and support their pain. The streets of Jerusalem are the halls of a hospital for the terminally ill, where the Christ continues to suffer today. The passion of Christ crosses the centuries and is revealed for our consideration today.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop: (Feast Day, March 23rd): St Turibius of Mogrovejo (1538-1606) was Archbishop of Lima, Peru. Born in Spain, he was educated in Law. Later he taught law at the University of Salamanca, a noted theological center. Due to his brilliance he was appointed chief judge of Grenada. He performed his office so well that he was chosen to fill the vacancy of the Archbishop of Lima, Peru. He objected that as a layman it was against the canons, but he was prevailed upon to accept the office. He was then ordained priest and bishop and set out for Peru, arriving at Lima in 1581, 43 years old.

The task facing him was enormous, but he set about carrying out the reforms mandated by the Council of Trent. He corrected the laxity of the clergy, sternly and courageously eradicating abuses. He spoke out against injustices and championed the cause of the poor. He worked tirelessly throughout the vast diocese, and endeared himself to all by his devotion, his teachings and missionary zeal. Without hesitation he faced up to opposition. Saint Turibius fell ill early in 1606, in his twenty fifth year as bishop, and died on March 23rd. He was canonized in 1731 as a model of holiness, apostolic zeal and one unwavering in truth.
