Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary time (B)

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

Fr. Virgilio Competente will be leaving us on Tuesday. Officially retired last year, he has been in residence at St. Mary's rectory this past year. He will be returning to his home in the Philippines where he was ordained a priest in 1967. He served as parochial vicar at Philip Neri, in the Bronx 1983-1994 and Holy Trinity, Manhattan 1981-1983. He has been our parochial vicar since 1994. He was incardinated into the Archdiocese of New York in 2000 and therefore is entitled in his retirement to all benefits that the Archdiocese offers to its priests. We thank him for his twenty years of service to our parish. I personally thank him for our friendship of twenty-one years. As Cardinal Dolan wrote in his letter to Fr. Virgilio: "A priest's retirement is canonical, in that it applies only to an assigned ministry. We never retire from the priesthood. The church, therefore, will continue to count on your daily prayers in the Liturgy of the Hours and the holy Sacrifice of the Mass." I am sure Fr. Virgilio will continue to pray for us.

Our parish finally reached its goal in the Cardinal's Stewardship Campaign with a \$200.00 pledge in the past week. I thank all who made a pledge and hope that you will fulfill your pledge. It seems to be getting harder for us to reach our goal of \$32,000.00

The Archdiocese plans to have a "Capital Improvement Campaign" beginning in 2016 or 2017. The last similar campaign was in 2007. At that time we were able to raise enough money to install our air conditioning system for the church. I will propose to our Parish Council that our project for this campaign will be to repair all the wooden frames that hold our stained glass windows. Most of our stained glass windows are in good shape (they are worth well over a million dollars). The problem is the wooden frames that hold the windows. They are disintegrating. Fixing or replacing the frames is going to be expensive. I don't think we have a choice.
