From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

The first part of today's Gospel has always disturbed me. It seems hypocritical. The reason that I take a less prominent place at the banquet is not out of humility but self interest. I do this as a way to get what I really want but in a devious way. It is like people we encounter who are saying one thing e.g. "I am not worthy of such an honor" but who really think that they are worthy. This may be a cultural difference but I find it disturbing to see this example in our Gospels.

The second part of the Gospel seems much more Christian and challenging and difficult. Think of the today's worldwide refugee problem.

Only the weeds enjoy this weather. Summer has been brutal with high temperatures and humidity. To go out and pull up weeds might lead to sunstroke so we reluctantly let them grow. The Japanese knotweed in our rectory garden has thrived. Even with plastic coverings it has managed to find openings that it can sneak through. When climate change has destroyed most of the world, my knotweed will find a way to survive.

Our campaign to raise money to repair our stained glass windows has just begun. Further information will be forthcoming in the next two months.

<u>Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time:</u> Today's Gospel is not about our dinner parties; it is a metaphor for how we interact with others in our lives. The first reading's message about humility sets the stage for the gospel reading. As we hear God's holy word today, let us listen for the message that we need to hear about whom we welcome into the banquet if our own lives.

<u>First Reading: Sirach 3:17-18(page31)</u> – a teacher finds great wisdom in humility; listening to God leads to benefits beyond anything this world could offer.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 68 (page 31&32) - "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor".

<u>Second Reading Hebrews 12:18-19(page 32)</u> we hear that Jesus is mediator of a new covenant; his sacrifice of love gives us a foretaste of heaven.

<u>Gospel: Luke 14:1,7-14 (page 32)</u> –Jesus takes advantage of eating at the home of a leading Pharisee to teach about humility and who should be invited to table fellowship.
