**Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)**

**From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:**

Our campaign to raise money to repair our stained glass windows is now reaching out to all our parishioners. So far we have received pledges of \$160,000.00. We need to raise another \$244,000.00 for a grand total of \$404,000.00. 26% of this goes to the Archdiocese. What the Archdiocese does with this money is clearly stated in the brochures that you received in the mail or at Mass last week and this week.

What is wrong with our stained glass windows? The best way to understand the problems is to go outside the church and look up at the windows. Look especially at the windows facing the Hudson River (the nine windows in the sanctuary) and the windows facing South Broadway (the rose window and the windows underneath). You will notice that the protective covering made of lexon have turned brown. That means that moisture had built up in the space between the actual stained glass windows and the lexon covering. Over the years this moisture has damaged the wooden framework that holds the actual stained glass. The stained glass will begin to come apart. This would be disastrous not only for the windows but also for our wonderful organ. You will also notice that some of the lexon coverings have been blown away by the winds from the Hudson River and the "northeaster" storms that hit the front of the Church.

Now look inside the church at the windows above the sanctuary, especially at the window of the Visitation (Elizabeth meeting Mary). There is visible water damage. You can also look at the frames holding the windows of the Apostles and see that repair need to be done.

Financially we can't afford to do all our hundred windows. But we must "renew and restore" as many windows as we can.
