Fifth Sunday of Lent (A)

From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

Climate change: I am empathizing with my early blooming daffodils. This year they bloomed too early and were flattened by the early frost. The early warm weather energized me to want to begin working in the garden. My spirits were high. Working in a garden is mentally and physically very good for me. It also keeps me from obsessing about our political situation. The cold weather killed the flowers. My spirits sipped. I felt flattened like my daffodils. I began asking “Is this early frost a onetime thing or is it a pattern? Is it caused by humans? I read an article in a newspaper this morning and loved these catchy sentences: “What happens in the Arctic does not stay in the Arctic.” We drive and chop and burn and fly, while the plants around us freeze and die.” “We dance and the plants pay the piper until they can’t play anymore. Then the bees pay. Then the farmers pay. Then we all pay.” “This time, take time to smell the flowers and consider how not long after their luck runs out for good, ours will too.”

I know that as soon as our other flowers bloom (including the late blooming daffodils), we will probably banish from our thoughts all this negative thinking about climate change. So make a Lenten resolution not to forget this early frost of 2017. If you think that changing the environment is too difficult or impossible, think of Easter.
