



Important Parish Updates - June 10, 2020

From Fr. Patrick Curley:

I received word last night that Sunday Mass resumes this upcoming weekend on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Our schedule will go back to what it was before the pandemic. Although this is great news, it has the potential to be a mess. The capacity of the gym and Church can only be at 25% normal capacity. This means no more than one hundred people at each Mass. Therefore, after a hundred people, we will have to close the gym and the Church. I'd suggest we keep a few things in mind.

1. Sunday Mass is not obligatory and will not be obligatory for the foreseeable future.
2. If you are Sixty-Five years old or older and/or have an underlying health condition, it is recommended that you do not come to Church at this point. That stated, you will not be turned away from coming to Mass.
3. Please consider coming to a weekday Mass instead. It will likely be much less crowded.

I've been told that people are not coming back to Church in big numbers in other areas of the country. Many people are still nervous about the virus. Other people find the restrictions burdensome and would rather not deal with them. For these reasons, I am not adding additional Masses on Sunday. Also, I will have to play catch-up with baptisms and weddings. Please be understanding.

For the weekend of June 14th, **ALL Masses will be at Our Lady of the Rosary Chapel.** This includes the Saturday 4pm Vigil Mass. Work on the roof of St. Peter's school is finishing and the school is closed. It is expected to reopen in the near future. Mass times are:

Saturday:

Vigil - 4:00pm (at Our Lady of the Rosary Chapel)

Sunday:

7:00am, 9:00am, 10:30am, 12:00pm, 5:00pm

For those going to the 4pm Saturday Vigil Mass, Confessions will be on Saturday, June 13th, from 3:00pm-3:45pm at Our Lady of the Rosary Chapel. They will be held in the sitting room of the chapel, and will be face-to-face.

Entry to the church will be through one door only. There will be a collection box near the entry of the church. You can drop your weekly offering into the box either before or after Mass. There will be no collection during Mass. Please support the parish to the best of your ability.

Due to Archdiocese guidelines, there will be no physical bulletin for the near future. Please refer to the parish website for the weekly bulletin.




