**TODAY'S READINGS****First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10**

Jonah set out for Nineveh as God asked and told the people that their city would be destroyed in forty days. The people believed him and repented from their evil ways. God did not destroy their city, showing his mercy for those who see the evil of their ways and correct it.

**Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31**

Paul advises the Corinthians that their world is changing, so they should not take their daily trials too seriously. We should remember that the problems of everyday living will not last forever, but the eternal life God promises us will.

**Gospel: Mark 1:14-20**

Jesus observes Simon and Andrew where they are fishing and tells them to come with him and become "fishers of men." They abandon their nets without hesitation to follow him. Next he calls James and his brother John, who also leave what they are doing and follow him without question.

**HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William Reilly**

"After John had been arrested Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: 'This is the time of fulfillment, the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.' ...Jesus said to them; 'Come after me and I will make you fishers of men.'"

We meet Jesus as He begins His public ministry as reported by Mark. In summary form the gospel writer tells us what will follow. The message of Jesus is quite clear: Repent and Believe.

In a few weeks we will hear those same words, as the blessed ashes are traced upon our foreheads, the external sign, reflects the disposition of our hearts. I ask myself, if I not only hear the words, but listen to them.

As Jesus invited the two sets of brothers to join Him in His ministry, so He calls us today, because this is the time of fulfillment as we are Missionary Disciples. If I truly believe the gospel is the Good News of Jesus, I walk with Him and bring His message to others.

**LECTURAS DE HOY****Primera Lectura: Jonás 3:1-5, 10**

Jonás salió para Nínive como Dios le había indicado, y le dijo a la gente que su ciudad sería destruida en cuarenta días. La gente le creyó y se arrepintió de sus pecados. Dios no destruyó la ciudad, mostrando misericordia para los que se dan cuenta de sus malas acciones y las corrigen.

**Segunda Lectura: 1 Corintios 7:29-31**

San Pablo le aconseja a los corintios que el mundo está cambiando, y que no deben preocuparse demasiado de los quehaceres diarios. Debemos recordar que los problemas del diario vivir no durarán por siempre, pero sí la vida eterna que Dios nos promete.

**Evangelio: San Marcos 1:14-20**

Jesús observa a Simón y Andrés pescar, y los llama para que vengan con él y se vuelvan "pescadores de hombres". Abandonan sus redes sin titubear y lo siguen. Luego llama a Santiago y a su hermano Juan, quienes también dejan al instante lo que estaban haciendo y lo siguen sin hacerse preguntas.

**SU PALABRA HOY por el Rev. William Reilly**

"Después de que Juan fuera arrestado, Jesús se dirigió a Galilea. Allí proclamaba la Buena Nueva de Dios, diciendo: 'El tiempo se ha cumplido: el Reino de Dios está cerca. Conviértanse y crean en la Buena Nueva'... Jesús les dijo: 'Sígueme, y yo los haré pescadores de hombres.'"

Encontramos a Jesús cuando comienza su ministerio público tal como lo cuenta San Marcos. En breve, el evangelista nos dice lo que va a pasar. El mensaje de Jesús es muy claro: Arrepiéntanse y Crean.

En pocas semanas escucharemos esas mismas palabras, cuando se nos marca la frente con ceniza bendecida. Esta señal externa, refleja la disposición de nuestros corazones. Me pregunto si no sólo oigo las palabras, sino que las escucho.

Así como Jesús invitó a dos parejas de hermanos a unírsele en Su ministerio, así nos llama El hoy, porque el tiempo se ha cumplido como Discípulos Misioneros. Si yo realmente creo que los evangelios son las Buenas Noticias de Jesús, yo camino con El y traigo Su mensaje a otros.

**CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL THE APOSTLE**

Saint Paul's entire life can be explained in terms of one experience—his meeting with Jesus on the road to Damascus. In an instant, he saw that all the zeal of his dynamic personality was being wasted, like the strength of a boxer swinging wildly. Perhaps he had never seen Jesus, who was only a few years older. But he had acquired a zealot's hatred of all Jesus stood for, as he began to harass the Church: "...entering house after house and dragging out men and women, he handed them over for imprisonment" (Acts 8:3b). Now he himself was "entered," possessed, all his energy harnessed to one goal—being a slave of Christ in the ministry of reconciliation, an instrument to help others experience the one Savior.

One sentence determined his theology: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5b). Jesus was mysteriously identified with people—the loving group of people Saul had been running down like criminals. Jesus, he saw, was the mysterious fulfillment of all he had been blindly pursuing.

From then on, his only work was to "present everyone perfect in Christ. For this I labor and struggle, in accord with the exercise of his power working within me" (Colossians 1:28b-29). "For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and [with] much conviction" (1 Thessalonians 1:5a).

Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message of the cross: Christians die baptismally to sin and are buried with Christ; they are dead to all that is sinful and unredeemed in the world. They are made into a new creation, already sharing Christ's victory and someday to rise from the dead like him. Through this risen Christ the Father pours out the Spirit on them, making them completely new.

So Paul's great message to the world was: You are saved entirely by God, not by anything you can do. Saving faith is the gift of total, free, personal and loving commitment to Christ, a commitment that then bears fruit in more "works" than the Law could ever contemplate.

## Catechesis for This Week / Categeusis Por Esta Semana

### ACTUAL SIN / PECADO REAL

from the *Baltimore Catechism* / del *Catecismo de Baltimore*

#### What three things are necessary to make a sin mortal?

To make a sin mortal these three things are needed:

1. the thought, desire, word, action, or omission must be seriously wrong or considered seriously wrong;
2. the sinner, must be mindful of the serious wrong;
3. the sinner must fully consent to it.

#### What is venial sin?

Venial sin is a less serious offense against the law of God, which does not deprive the soul of sanctifying grace, and which can be pardoned even without sacramental confession.

*Be ye therefore perfect, as also your heavenly Father is perfect. (Matthew 6:48)*

#### How can a sin be venial?

A sin can be venial in two ways:

1. when the evil done is not seriously wrong;
2. when the evil done is seriously wrong, but the sinner sincerely believes it is only slightly wrong, or does not give full consent to it.

#### How does venial sin harm us?

Venial sin harms us by making us less fervent in the service of God, by weakening our power to resist mortal sin, and by making us deserving of God's punishments in this life or in purgatory.

*But I tell you, that of every idle word men speak, they shall give account on the day of judgment. (Matthew 12:36)*

#### How can we keep from committing sin?

We can keep from committing sin by praying and by receiving the sacraments; by remembering that God is always with us; by recalling that our bodies are temples of the Holy Ghost; by keeping occupied with work or play; by promptly resisting the sources of sin within us; by avoiding the near occasions of sin.

*And if thy right hand scandalize thee, cut it off and cast it from thee. For it is expedient for thee that one of thy members perish rather than that thy whole body go into hell. (Mark 9:42)*

#### ¿Qué tres cosas son necesarias para hacer un pecado mortal?

Para hacer un pecado mortal, estas tres cosas son necesarias:

1. el pensamiento, el deseo, la palabra, la acción u omisión deben estar seriamente equivocados o ser considerados seriamente incorrectos;
2. el pecador, debe ser consciente del error grave;
3. el pecador debe consentir plenamente.

#### ¿Qué es el pecado venial?

El pecado venial es una ofensa menos grave contra la ley de Dios, que no priva al alma de la gracia santificante, y que puede ser perdonada incluso sin la confesión sacramental.

*Sed pues perfectos, como también vuestro Padre celestial es perfecto. (Mateo 6:48)*

#### ¿Cómo puede un pecado ser venial?

Un pecado puede ser venial de dos maneras:

1. cuando el mal hecho no está seriamente mal;
2. cuando el mal hecho está seriamente mal, pero el pecador sinceramente cree que solo está un poco mal, o no le da su total consentimiento.

#### ¿Cómo nos puede dañar el venial?

El pecado venial nos perjudica al hacernos menos fervientes al servicio de Dios, al debilitar nuestro poder para resistir el pecado mortal y al hacernos merecedores de los castigos de Dios en esta vida o en el purgatorio.

*Pero les digo, que de cada palabra ociosa que los hombres hablen, darán cuenta en el día del juicio. (Mateo 12:36)*

#### ¿Cómo podemos evitar cometer pecado?

Podemos evitar cometer pecados orando y recibiendo los sacramentos; al recordar que Dios siempre está con nosotros; recordando que nuestros cuerpos son templos del Espíritu Santo; manteniéndose ocupado con el trabajo o el juego; al resistir prontamente las fuentes del pecado dentro de nosotros; evitando las ocasiones cercanas de pecado.

*Y si tu mano derecha te escandaliza, córtala y échala de ti. Porque es conveniente para ti que uno de tus miembros perezca en lugar de que todo tu cuerpo vaya al infierno. (Marcos 9:42)*

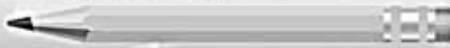
