The 18th. Sunday in Ordinary Time July 31, 2016

First Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

A negative theme of "vanity" opens this book, and the author uses an analysis of fruitless toil to make his point. The perspective he offers is meant to engender humility in us.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-5; 9-11
Jesus Christ fulfills the messianic promises. Paul uses a baptismal image in writing "put to death the old earthly parts of yourself" to teach his disciples how to handle vices and virtues.

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

This passage looks at the problems that possessions can cause a disciple. Only a fool lets his ego turn him astray, as shown by the rich man in Jesus' story who keeps using the words "I" and "my" in his boasting, thus eliminating God from the picture.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Cameras inside cell phones have made picture taking nearly everybody's hobby. Whenever a celebrity is around, so do "selfies" follow. Even our patient Pope Francis has made himself available for such, and I bless him for his accommodation to what must be at times a pesky pilgrim.

But no cell phone camera can catch an abstraction like "greed." So a photographer would have to resort to illustrations of greed like a sizable mansion behind a manicured lawn; or a shiny car costing more than a house; or shelves full of glittering jewelry.

All of those images stack up against the teaching in today's Mass Readings on the dangers of wealth, which would demand a different set of photos for sure. Perhaps the face of a former lottery winner whose life was ruined. Or a wealthy patient caught bribing a doctor to give him unproven medical treatment. Or a Wall Street broker's abandoned office.

You and I cannot live in this materialistic culture of ours without being affected. We feel its pressure. Advertising urges us to see a prospective purchase as a necessity easily available with a handy installment plan available. So we need our Scripture; we need the Lord's Word to combat the temptations. And we need even more stories like today's Gospel to drive the point home. Here's one of those, simply called "Hans and Carl."

Once upon a time there was a proud man named Carl who loved to ride his horse through his vast estate, and to congratulate himself on his enormous wealth. One day he came upon Hans, an old tenant farmer, who had sat down to eat his lunch in the shade of a great oak tree. Hans' head was bowed in prayer. When Hans looked up, he said, "Oh, excuse me, sir. I didn't see you. I was giving thanks for my food."

"Humph!" snorted the rich man, noticing the coarse dark bread and cheese that made up the old man's lunch. "If that were all I had to eat," he sneered, "I don't think I'd feel like giving thanks." "Oh," replied Hans, "it's quite sufficient. But it's remarkable that you should come here today because I feel I have to tell you something. I had a strange dream just before awakening this morning." "And what did you dream?" Carl asked with an amused smile. The old man answered, "There was beauty and peace all around, and yet I could hear a voice saying 'The richest man in the valley will die tonight.' "Ah, dreams!" cried Carl. "Nonsense!"

He turned and galloped away, and Hans prayed as he watched the horse and its rider disappear. "Die tonight!' mused Carl. "It's ridiculous! No use going into a panic." The best thing to do, he decided, was to forget the old man's dream.

And yet- he couldn't forget it. He had felt fine, at least until Hans described that crazy dream of his. Now he wasn't sure that he felt that well. So that evening he called his doctor, who was a personal friend. He asked him to come over right away. When his friend arrived, Carl told him of the old man's dream about the richest man in the valley dying this very night.

"Ah," replied the doctor, "sounds like poppycock to me, but for your own peace of mind, let me examine you." A little later, the examination complete, the doctor was full of smiles and assurances. He said, "Carl, you're as strong and healthy as that horse you ride. There's no way that you're going to die tonight."

The doctor was just closing his bag when a messenger arrived, out of breath at the manor door. "Doctor, doctor!" he cried, "Come quickly! It's old Hans. He just died in his sleep!"
