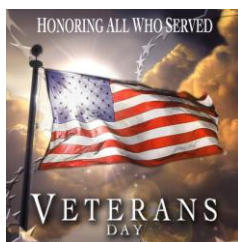

NOTES FROM THE LOFT
The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Catholics sometimes forget that the pope is also a bishop with his own cathedral church. Today's celebration of the "Dedication of the Lateran Basilica" turns the attention of the universal Church to the diocese of Rome and the primacy of its Bishop among bishops, Pope Francis, and his particular seat of authority, his 'chair' (Latin: 'cathedra') from which he speaks like a shepherd to his local flock.

The site of the Papal Archbasilica of St. John Lateran and its adjoining Palace has an interesting history, dating back to the time of Nero. The Lateranus family held the property (which sits over a former Roman fort) until it was given to the Church in the 3rd century AD by the Emperor Constantine. In 324 Pope Sylvester I declared it a "Domus Dei", i.e. House of God, placing within it the papal throne, the 'chair' of the Bishop of Rome. As such it became the "mother church" – "Mater et Caput" – of the world. It would survive a sacking by 5th century Vandals and an earthquake in 898.

In the 10th century, Pope Sergius III dedicated it to St. John the Baptist; in the 12th century, Pope Lucius II placed it also under the patronage of St. John the Evangelist, making them co-patrons with Christ the Savior. It became the site of five ecumenical Councils, each bearing the name "Lateran" (as in Vatican II). It housed the popes until the election of the Frenchman, Clement V, in 1305 who established his seat in Avignon, France. After being ravaged by fires in 1307 and 1361, the decision was made to construct the Palace of the Vatican, the papal residence, next to the existing Basilica of St. Peter.

Today's readings celebrate the 'Domus Dei', the Temple of God, the New Jerusalem, the Holy City. The Gospel speaks of the Temple of Christ's own Body. The Church is His 'Mystical Body', His Bride. He is the "husband who entrusts his heart to her", who will be "praised...and given a reward for her labors" as described in the First Reading from Proverbs. She is the "fruitful vine" and we, her children, the "olive plants" of Psalm 128.

Especially appropriate for the liturgy for the dedication of a church, the Choir's Communion Meditation today will be the contemporary piece, I SAW WATER FLOWING by Katy Feeney in the "Call and Response" genre.
