PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT September 2018 – August 2019

Newly ordained Father John Figueroa was sent to be our new Parochial Vicar. He is the latest in a long line of newly ordained priests assigned to Seton. We welcomed him to our parish family.

Our Coordinator of Religious Education (CRE), Sara Koshofer, retired after 12 years of dedicated service to our Religious Education Ministry. She did a great job in developing the program to meet the needs of our current students, while maintaining the highest of standards amid a changing landscape. We welcomed Donna Vallario as our new CRE. She brings an array of professional skills and talents and has eagerly begun building upon the strong foundations laid by Sara Koshofer.

Our Parish Office is running efficiently. Parish Secretary Mary Ellen Modico continues to manage the challenges of the front office with the faithful help of Teresa McCue-Fleming and a number of receptionists. Webmaster Noreen Donnellan keeps our Website fresh, and Parish Manager James Scolaro is ever so busy overseeing numerous capital projects including the Seton Parish Center project.

Our Renew+Rebuild Archdiocesan Capital Campaign continues. We are most grateful to those who have faithfully honored their commitments, especially those who pledged over five years. A highlight was the recent dedication of the new Seton Parish Center by Cardinal Dolan on January 12, 2020. This marked the completion of the largest of the significant projects of the campaign. Attention is now focused on upgrades to the gym.

A special note of thanks to all Seton parishioners who have faithfully increased their weekly offertory as a result of our *A Coffee a Day* initiative. Especially noteworthy is your faithful generosity to our monthly *Emergency Maintenance* second collection which provides funds for ongoing repairs. Your continued generous stewardship has enabled us to continue with needed campus improvements.

Our Parish Trustees, Finance Council and Parish Council continue to provide great leadership as we plan for the future.
