What is Anointing of the Sick?



As a sacrament, it is one of the ways Jesus assists us in life and offers his divine help. Anointing of the sick is for Catholics who are sick or facing life threatening situations (such as major surgery or serious medical emergency) as well as those who may be facing imminent death. Because of the notion that calling a priest for this sacrament may mean giving up on a dying loved one, many Catholics wait until too late to call a priest. Doing this risks leaving the dying person without the important graces of this sacrament. If you or a family member are in need of this Sacrament, or are unsure of when they should receive this sacrament, please call the parish office.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day July 14th

- * St. Kateri Tekakwitha was the first Native American saint in the United States and Canada
- * Her mother was a Christian Algonquin and her father was a Chief of Mohawks
- * She is also known as “Lily of the Mohawks” in recognition of her kindness, prayer, faith, and heroic suffering
- * She was orphaned at age 4 when smallpox claimed most of her village and all of her family
- * She was introduced to Catholicism by three Jesuit missionaries during her teenage years
- * St. Kateri Tekakwitha died just before turning 24 and is buried in Kahnawake, Quebec
- * Pope Benedict XVI canonized her on Oct. 21, 2012
- * She is the patron saint of ecology, the environment, and the Native American people
- * She is remembered at our own Blessed Sacrament Chapel by adorning one of the stained glass windows above the altar
