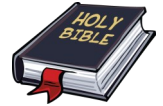

St. Columbanus has an active, engaged and rewarding volunteer community. As coronavirus restrictions become relaxed, the parish community will certainly be looking to get back to whatever activities than can do safely. There are several parish organizations which are always welcoming new members. Below are a few of them. If you have the time, please consider helping your parish; it's a rewarding experience. Call the rectory for information.

Knights of Columbanus:

Has a work crew to repair both churches and perform specific landscaping to the grounds. Raises \$30,000 per year for charities, the majority of which goes to the Parish and St. Columbanus school; along with the Putnam Valley Food Pantry. Provides about six free Communion Brunches and Grab-'N-Go Brunches for both churches.

Rosary Altar Society:

Has a crew which cleans the altar linens. Holds a few fundraisers for the Church, particularly the annual Craft Fair, which has been ongoing for over 20 years.

Columbiettes:

Holds fundraisers, and assists the parish.

Bible Study:

Monday or Wednesday groups get together to read and discuss the bible in an organized setting.

St. Junipero Serra (1713-1784)

This Wednesday is the feast day of Junipero Serra the great Franciscan missionary, canonized on September 23, 2015, by Pope Francis. In California a statue of him was pulled down by vandals. These people are ignorant of history and are evil. The anarchy going on in our country that is supported by liberal political elements is nothing less than an attack on Western Culture, and specifically the Catholic Church. These groups are anti-life anti-family. They are pro-abortion, pro-sodomy, and pro-socialism/communism, as their own documents state. As St. Paul wrote to the Ephesians:

For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the au-

thorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm.

Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness.

As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace.

With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one.

Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. (Ephesians 6: 12-18)

St. Junipero was a champion of the native people as the following biography from Catholic.org. First is a quote from San Francisco Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone who insisted that Serra was a champion and protector of indigenous people.

“St. Serra made heroic sacrifices to protect the indigenous people of California from their Spanish conquerors, especially the soldiers. Even with his infirmed leg which caused him such pain, he walked all the way to Mexico City to obtain special faculties of governance from the Viceroy of Spain in order to discipline the military who were abusing the Indians. And then he walked back to California,” Archbishop Cordileone said.

Miguel Jose Serra was born on the island of Majorca on November 24, 1713, and took the name of Junipero when in 1730, he entered the Franciscan Order. Ordained in 1737, he taught philosophy and theology at the University of Padua until 1749.

At the age of thirty-seven, he landed in Mexico City on January 1, 1750, and spent the rest of his life working for the conversion of the peoples of the New World.

In 1768, Father Serra took over the missions of the Jesuits (who had been wrongly expelled by the government) in the Mexican province of Lower California and Upper California (modern day California). An indefatigable worker, Serra was in large part responsible for the foundation and spread of the Church on the West Coast of the United States when it was still mission territory.

He founded twenty-one missions and converted thousands of Indians. The converts were taught sound methods of agriculture, cattle raising, and arts and crafts.

Junipero was a dedicated religious and missionary. He was imbued with a penitential spirit and practiced austerity in sleep, eating, and other activities. On August 28, 1784, worn out by his apostolic labors, Father Serra was called to his eternal rest. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II on September 25, 1988. His statue, representing the state of California, is in National Statuary Hall. His feast day is July 1.
