First Reading ACTS 14:21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

Second Reading REV 21:1-5A

Then I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. I also saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away." The One who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."

When Judas had left them, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and God will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Primera lectura Hch 14, 21b-27

En aquellos días, volvieron Pablo y Bernabé a Listra, Iconio y Antioquía, y ahí animaban a los discípulos y los exhortaban a perseverar en la fe, diciéndoles que hay que pasar por muchas tribulaciones para entrar en el Reino de Dios. En cada comunidad designaban presbíteros, y con oraciones y ayunos los encomendaban al Señor, en quien habían creído. Atravesaron luego Pisidia y llegaron a Panfilia; predicaron en Perge y llegaron a Atalía. De ahí se embarcaron para Antioquía, de donde habían salido, con la gracia de Dios, para la misión que acababan de cumplir. Al llegar, reunieron a la comunidad y les contaron lo que había hecho Dios por medio de ellos y cómo les había abierto a los paganos las puertas de la fe.

Proof of Discipleship: If you pay attention to catholic websites or social media, you might discover some mean-spirited comments about fellow Christians who hold different viewpoints than the writer's. Reading these articles or comments might lead us to believe that the proof of discipleship is measured by one's level of orthodoxy, obedience, liberalism, or what ever measuring stick is used.

The Gospel today reminds us that the proof of discipleship is not how right we are but how loving we are. If we are to follow Jesus' commandment to love one another as he has loved us, there can be no room in our language or in our hearts for such meanness.

How do we live out our call to be witnesses of the Gospel when we encounter others who may disagree with us? Let us remember today's Gospel and that our primary objective is to love as Jesus loved us. This requires an ongoing, gradual relationship that recognizes the dignity of each person and sees them as our brother or sister in Christ.

Dear brothers and sisters,

My letter this week is directed to single men and women ages 18-40. If this doesn't describe you and you don't know anyone that it describes, you can skip the rest without missing anything.

Recognizing a vocation, whether it be to married life, to an unmarried life, or to a religious life, is a matter of understanding how God speaks to us and how to listen. The process is the same no matter what God calls us to. When I was in the seminary, I met some remarkable men who, after years of learning to recognize God's call, discovered that He was not calling them to the life of a priest. I have always thought that they would someday make excellent husbands because they truly understood vocation.

If you want to understand vocation and how God calls us, I urge you to consider one of two retreats this summer: The Life Awareness Retreat in English (July 5-6) or the Vengan y Vean Retreat in Spanish (July 6-7). These retreats are virtually free thanks to the support of the Serra Club...only \$20.00.

Sponsored by the Archdiocesan Office of Vocations they are focused on religious life, but to whatever God calls us, He calls us in the same way. What you learn at these retreats, the time you spend with Him, the conversations you have with others, all will help you to recognize your own vocation whatever it may be.

If you are in a place in your life where you want to consider more deeply your path in life, I again urge you to attend one of these retreats. It is a couple of days that may change your life or give you the confidence to know that you are already on the right path with the Lord.

Mi carta esta semana está dirigida a los, hombres y mujeres solteros de edades 18-40. Si esto no lo describe a usted y usted no conoce a nadie que lo describa, puede omitir el resto de esta carta sin perderse nada.

Reconocer una vocación, ya sea a la vida matrimonial, a una vida soltera o a una vida religiosa, es una cuestión de entender cómo Dios nos habla y cómo escuchar. El proceso es el mismo, no importa a lo que Dios nos llame.

Cuando estaba en el seminario, conocí a algunos hombres notables que, después de años de aprender a reconocer el llamado de Dios, descubrieron que Él no los estaba llamando a la vida del sacerdocio.
