Conversation Guides to Teach Children about Sexual Integrity

- * **Preschool:** Private parts of the body; reasons for using correct names.
- * **Elementary:** Sex is private. It's always OK to tell someone "No" if you don't want them to touch you.
- * **Middle School:** "You don't need to wear something like that to get attention."
- * **High School:** Help your teen to feel safe in talking to you.

Protect Your Children from Early Sex

- **Teen Sexual Activity and STDs/STIs**

Statistics show that sexually active teens and young adults are at higher risk for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) than older adults, because of behavioral, biological and cultural factors. STIs can rob them of their future fertility.
