

3rd Sunday of Advent – pink and 2 purple candles – Dear God, help each person in our family understand the true meaning of Christmas. Fill us with your joy!

Activity – Look for stars wherever you go; think about how Christ is guiding your life like the star guided the wise men!

4th Sunday of Advent – all the candles! – Dear God, help each person in our family to experience the love of Christ. Fill us with wonder and awe at your great love for us!

Activity – collect food for your local food closet and share the love!
