
Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 24, 2016



Reflection on the Scriptures

One of His disciples asked Him, 'Lord, teach us to pray.' " —Luke 11:1

Sometimes our prayer is a projection of our own self-hatred rather than a communication with God. For instance, Abraham began interceding for Sodom and Gomorrah by saying: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes!" (Genesis 18:27) Later in his prayer, Abraham begged God not to become impatient (Genesis 18:30) or angry (Genesis 18:32) with him, as if God could be impatient or angry. Abraham projected his own problems onto God. Eventually, Abraham quit interceding for Sodom and Gomorrah. He may have thought these cities didn't deserve to be saved or that God wouldn't save them, although God had repeatedly said He would. Abraham was impatient with God's timing.

When we pray, may we not project our self-hatred, problems, and limitations onto God. Rather, may we let God project His love, holiness, and power onto us. We pray not in order to change God but to allow Him to change us. Praying is not God-changing; rather, it is "uschanging," which makes it life-changing. "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1).

ST. IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR THE LAY FAITHFUL:

- If a Catholic is getting married, the Catholic party is <u>obligated</u> to be married in the Catholic Church in order to remain in good standing with the Church. Fr. William is happy to assist couples who are only married civilly to be married in the Church. The process is not complicated or expensive. Please speak to him after Mass.
- Infants should be baptized within a few months after birth. Prolonging the baptism for a year or more denies the child the grace and protection of the sacrament. Parents of children (7 or under) can arrange a meeting with Zach to schedule the baptism. Children 7 years or older are prepared according to the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.
- It is important not to delay the Anointing of the Sick. If a loved one is seriously ill or receiving hospice care, please call the Parish Office to arrange for the Sacrament of the Anointing. The Anointing of the Sick is also celebrated every 3rd Saturday after the 5:15 PM Mass.
- Catholics must treat the cremated remains of a loved one with reverence. It is not acceptable to scatter the ashes at sea or to keep them in the home. They must be buried in the ground or at sea (the whole urn), or placed in a columbarium. Please contact the Parish Office to assist with the proper disposition of a loved one's cremated remains.
