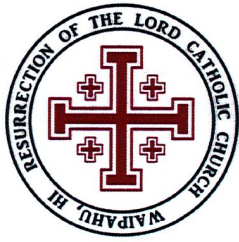

Dear Parishioners & Friends of ROL:

Spiritual growth and renewal are a continual part of the life of any Christian. They are also vital to the life of our parish. An important aspect of spiritual growth is embodied in the **principle of stewardship**. Through stewardship, we thank God for all His blessings by returning to him a portion of our time, talent, and treasure he has given to us.

During the next few weeks, you will be hearing more about stewardship and the difference it can make in your life. You will be asked to reflect on three areas of stewardship and how you are living them out as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Among the important questions are:

- **Time.** Do you set aside 10-15 minutes of quiet time with the Lord every day for prayer and study? (I recommend *The Word Among Us* as a daily devotional book available at www.wau.org)
- **Talent.** Are you using your God-given gifts to serve in ministry in the Church and in mission in the world? (Our goal is to have every member serve in a ministry!)
- **Treasure.** What percentage of your annual income do you presently give to support our parish? (Try our 90-day Tithing Challenging!)

Over the course of the next few weeks, you will be hearing more from me about stewardship and our lay witnesses will talk about their personal experiences with stewardship. On the weekend of November 2/3, we will have a Ministry Fair in the Parish Hall so you can explore different ministries in the parish. On the weekend of November 16/17, we will have our annual Commitment Sunday when you can renew your personal commitment to be the best steward of God's gifts.

Thank you for taking time to pray and reflect on what it means to practice stewardship as our response to all that God has done for us. Be assured of my love and prayers on the journey!
