Parish Guidelines

General Information

1. At least one party must be Catholic.
2. Weddings are celebrated in the *church building only*, Monday through Saturday, between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Weddings are not scheduled on Sundays, during the sacred Triduum, holy days, or civic holidays.
3. Your marriage preparation should begin at least 6 months prior to your proposed wedding date.

Preparation

Your marriage preparation should begin at least 6 months prior to your proposed wedding date. It is necessary for couples in the Diocese of Honolulu to complete the Catholic Engaged Encounter weekend retreat. The retreat can be scheduled online at: www.hawaiicee.org.

Offering

For non-registered parishioners, the suggested donation to Resurrection of the Lord Church is \$1000.00. This amount does not include the services of the priest or the fee for the musician.

Marriage License

You will need to obtain a marriage license from the State of Hawaii Department of Health prior to the wedding. It is to be completed online. **Please bring the marriage license worksheet with your license number on it to the rehearsal.** We will add the Marriage Performer's license number online and a license will be generated and mailed directly to you.

Rehearsal

We will be happy to schedule a rehearsal for you and your wedding party before your wedding day. The rehearsal usually lasts about 45 minutes to 1 hour. This may be scheduled by contacting our Parish Office.

Flowers

You are welcome to add flower arrangements (except during Lent) provided they do not obstruct the view of the altar, ambo, cathedral or presider's chair. No flower petals, rice, birdseed, or confetti may be thrown inside or outside the church.

Music

Only sacred songs and instrumental music appropriate for Catholic liturgy will be permitted in the church. All music must be approved and arranged with one of our parish musicians (Nick Caldeza or Kainoa Fukumoto) who will also provide accompaniment for the liturgy.

You may contact them through the Parish Office and the fee for the musician is \$150.00 payable directly to the musician. Other musicians are welcome to accompany our parish musician provided they conform to the norms for Catholic worship and are approved by the parish musician in advance.

Photography/Videography

We understand the desire to preserve the wedding on film and videotape. Professional photographers and videographers are welcome to take pictures during the liturgy provided that no flash photography is used, no one enters the sanctuary, and the movement of the participants is not impeded by the photographer. Videographers and photographers should check with the wedding coordinator or officiating priest/deacon prior to the start of the wedding.

Unity Candle & Sand Ceremony

The lighting of a "unity candle" and the sand ceremony is not part of the Roman Catholic marriage ritual. The primary symbols of a couples' unity are the vows themselves, the rings, and the reception of the Eucharist. If the unity candle is important to you, we suggest you make it part of the Table Prayer at the reception.

Church Furnishings

Additional decorations should not be taped, nailed, or tacked to the pews, chairs, or walls and must be removed following the ceremony.

Food and Beverages

Neither is allowed in the church. Consumption of any alcohol or drugs prior to the liturgy will result in the cancellation of the wedding.

Dressing & Parking Facilities

Unfortunately, we do not have changing rooms at the parish. We suggest the couple come to the church dressed for the ceremony. A small room for the bridal attendants will be available to freshen up before the wedding ceremony. Restroom facilities are available. There is ample parking for guests.

Visitor Weddings from Out of State

1. Contact your parish priest to begin the formal preparation required by your home diocese. Once your preparation program is completed, your priest will send the marriage documents to your local diocese of review. After their review is completed, they will forward the documents to: **The Tribunal, Diocese of Honolulu, St. Stephen Diocesan Center, 6701 Pali Hwy, Kaneohe, HI 96744.** Following the approval of our Chancellor, your documents will be forwarded to Resurrection of the Lord. Your marriage will be recorded in our parish register and your files will remain as permanent records of Resurrection of the Lord Church.
2. After you have met with your priest, contact our Parish Office to reserve the date of your wedding. We can advise on the availability of the church at that time and will hold your requested date.
3. We also request you send a Letter of Intent to the Resurrection of the Lord Church to include the following:
 - a. The couple's names, religion, home addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses.
 - b. The date and time of the wedding.
 - c. The complete names of your witnesses (Best Man, Maid/Matron of Honor). **Two witnesses are required.**
 - d. The name, address, and phone number of your parish church.
 - e. The name of the priest preparing you for marriage.
 - f. The date of arrival in Honolulu and local contact information.
4. You will also need obtain your **State of Hawaii Marriage License** as soon as you arrive in Honolulu. You will need to show a form of picture identification at the time you apply for your license. You can apply for the marriage license online through the State of Hawaii Department of Health website. **Please bring the marriage license worksheet and any financial offering with you for the church, the minister, and musician to the rehearsal.**

Bringing Your Own Priest

If you wish to have another priest, who resides outside the State of Hawaii, to preside at your marriage, it is necessary that he provide a Letter of Suitability from his Ordinary or Religious Superior. He must also obtain a marriage performer license from the State of Hawaii. He can apply for this online through the State of Hawaii Department of Health website. There are also additional requirements for the Diocese of Honolulu. Our office and the Diocese of Honolulu will need to receive copies of his license and paperwork several weeks before the wedding date. Please note the offering for the use of the church remains the same.
